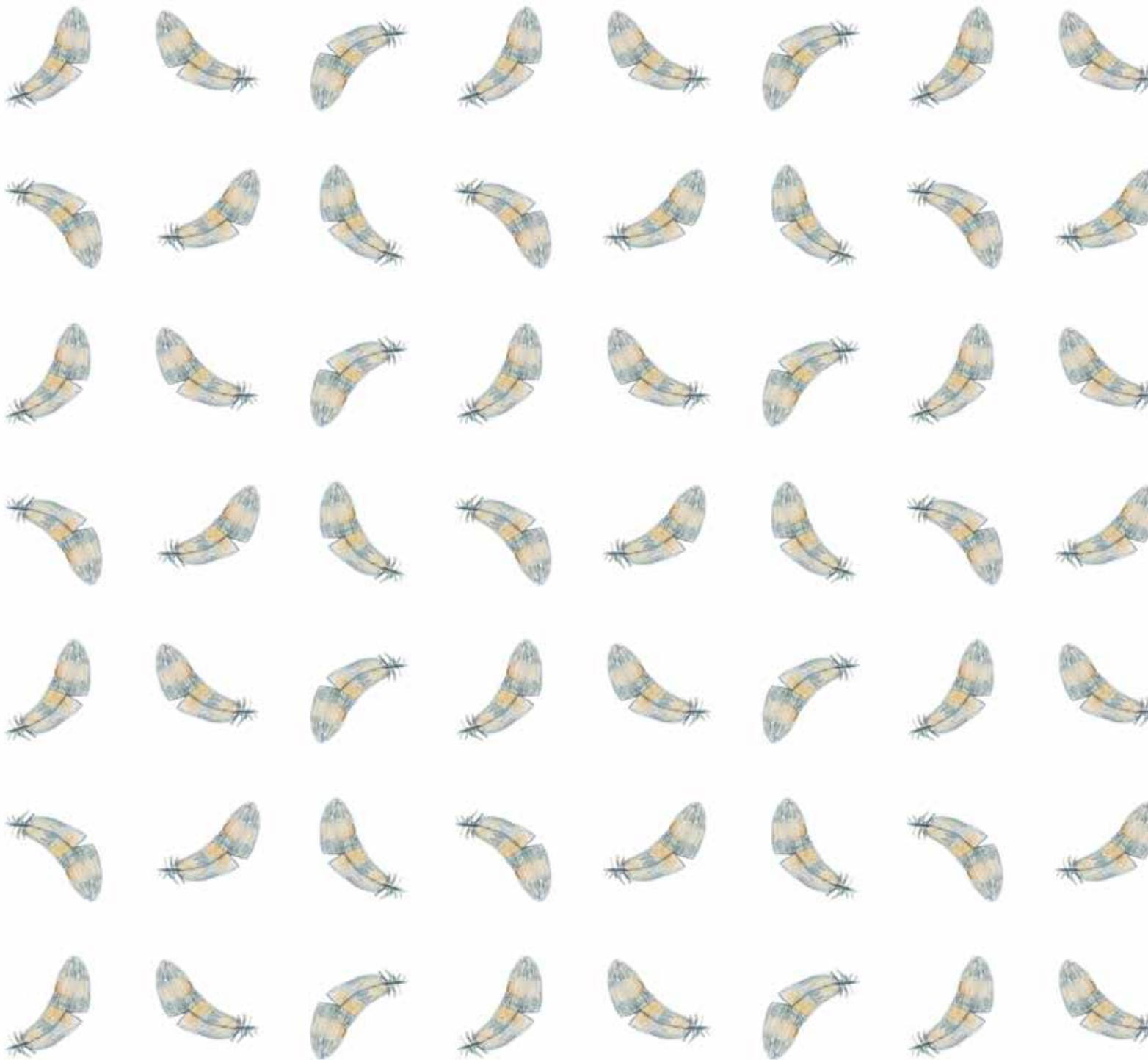
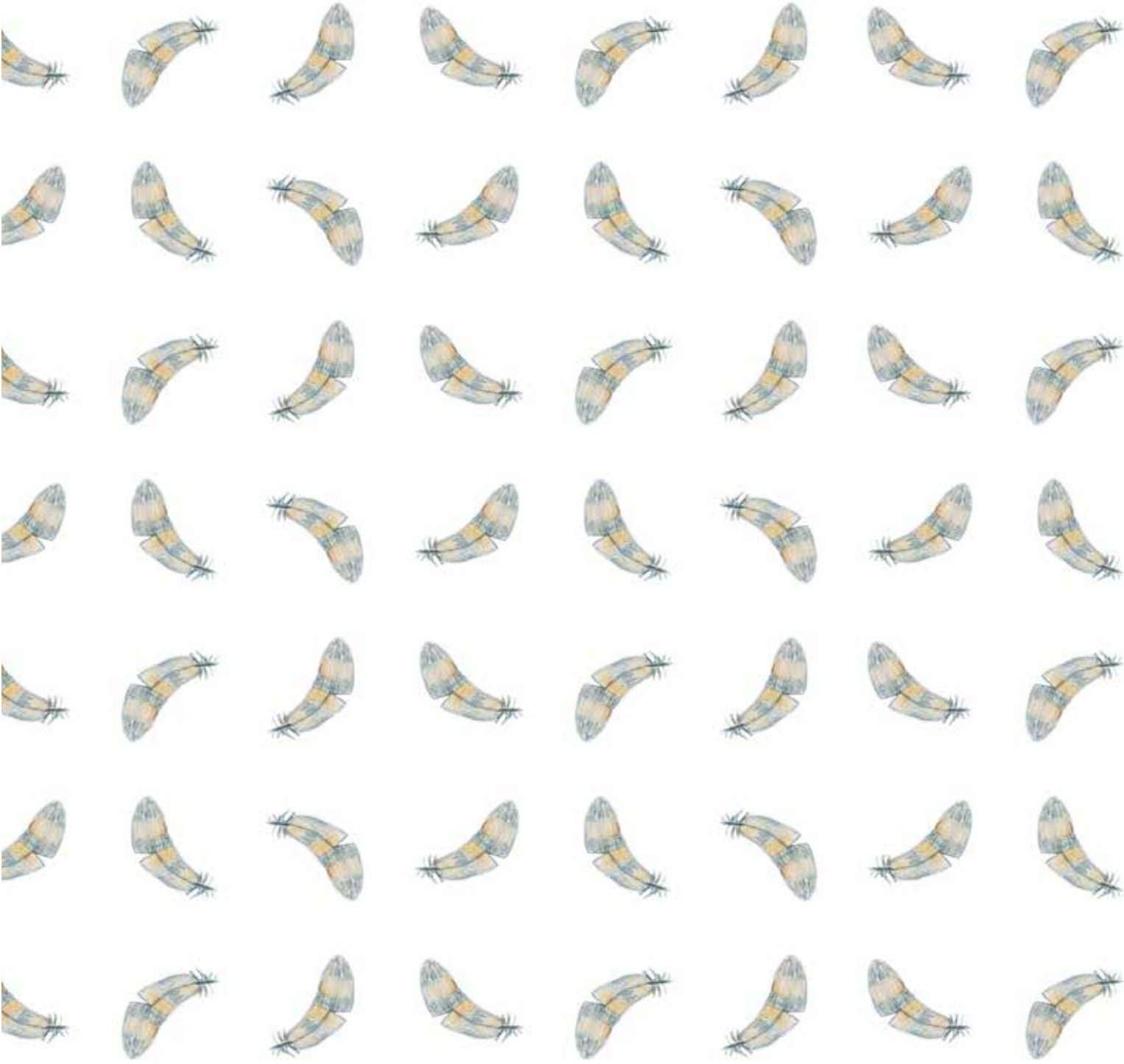

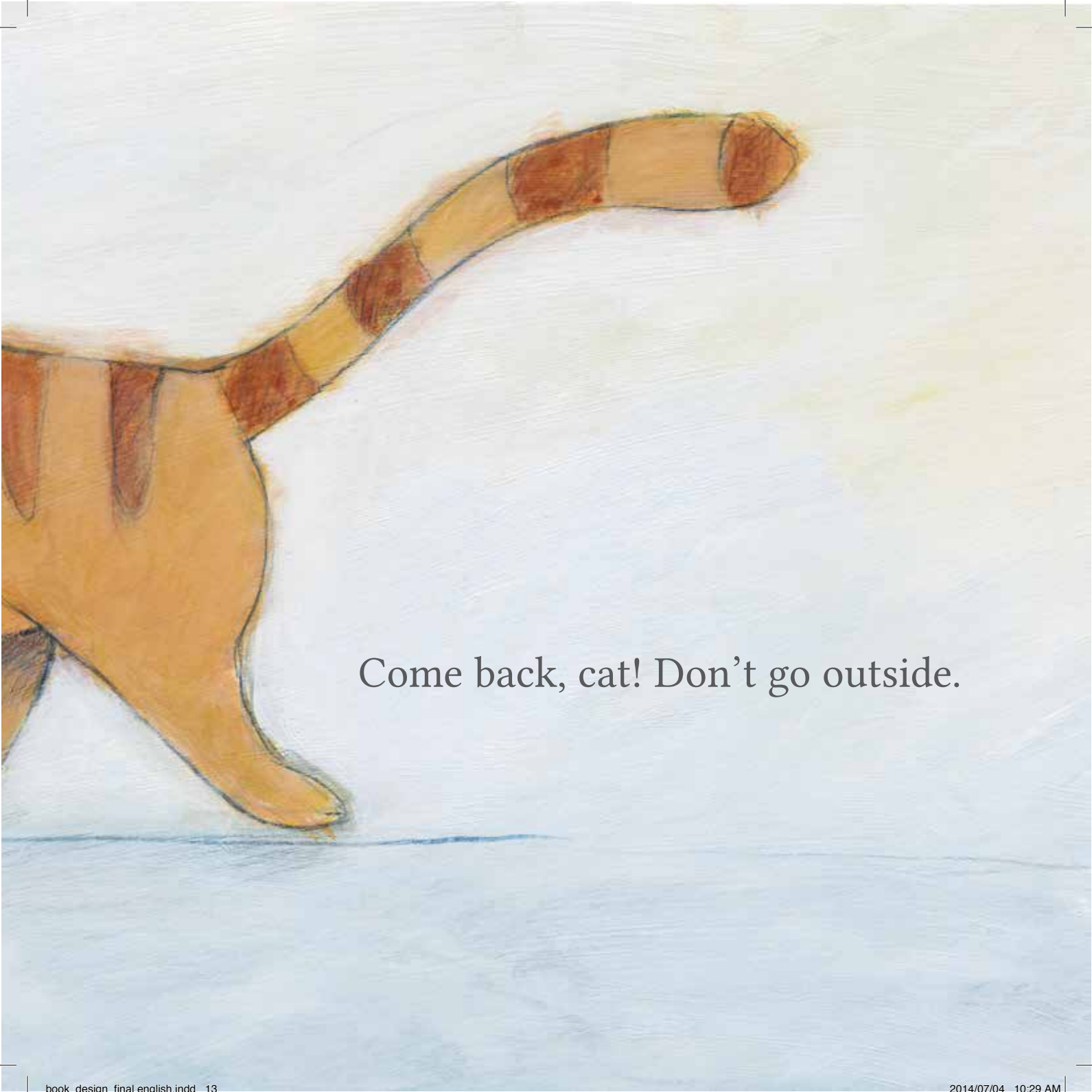
Sit in your basket. Stay right here!

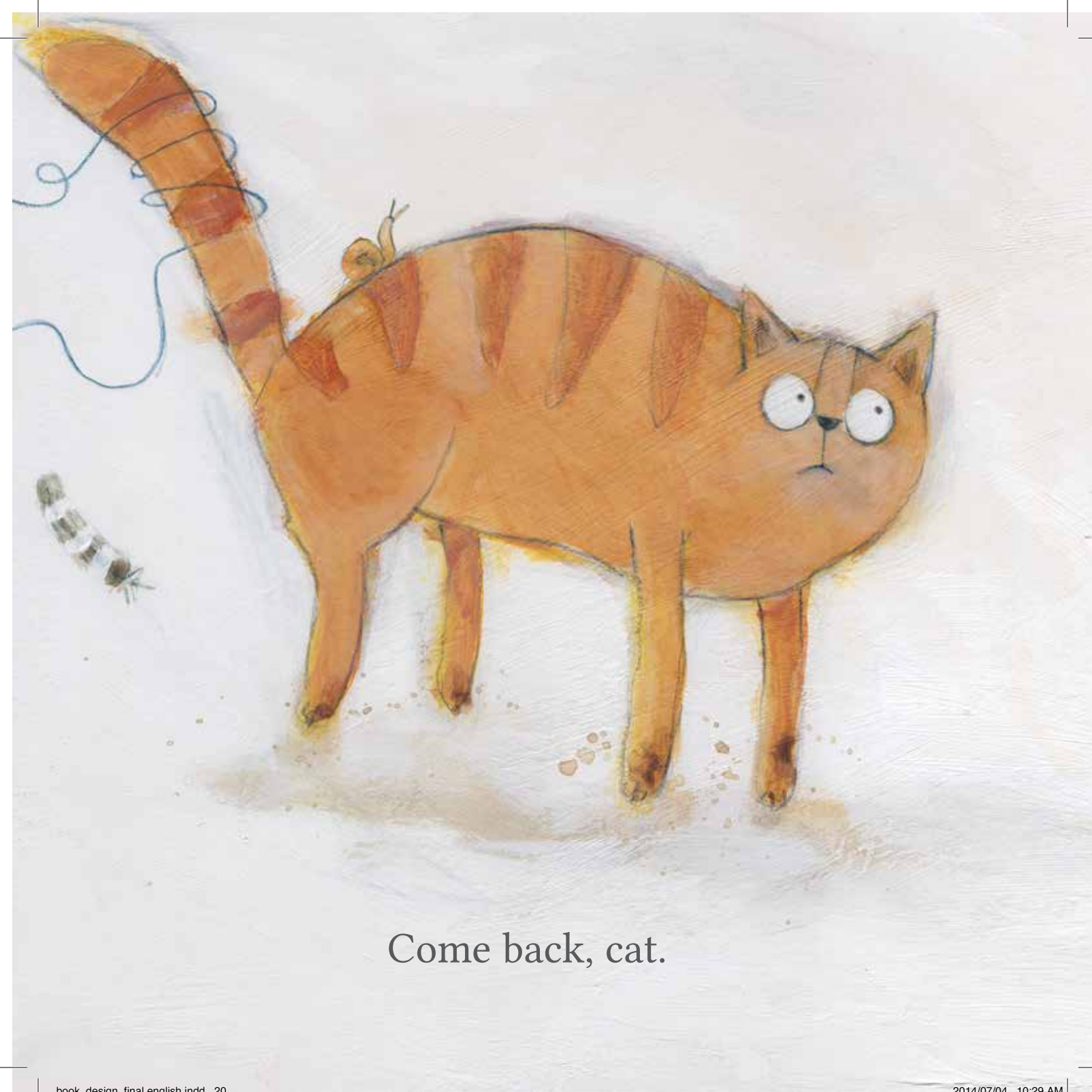
