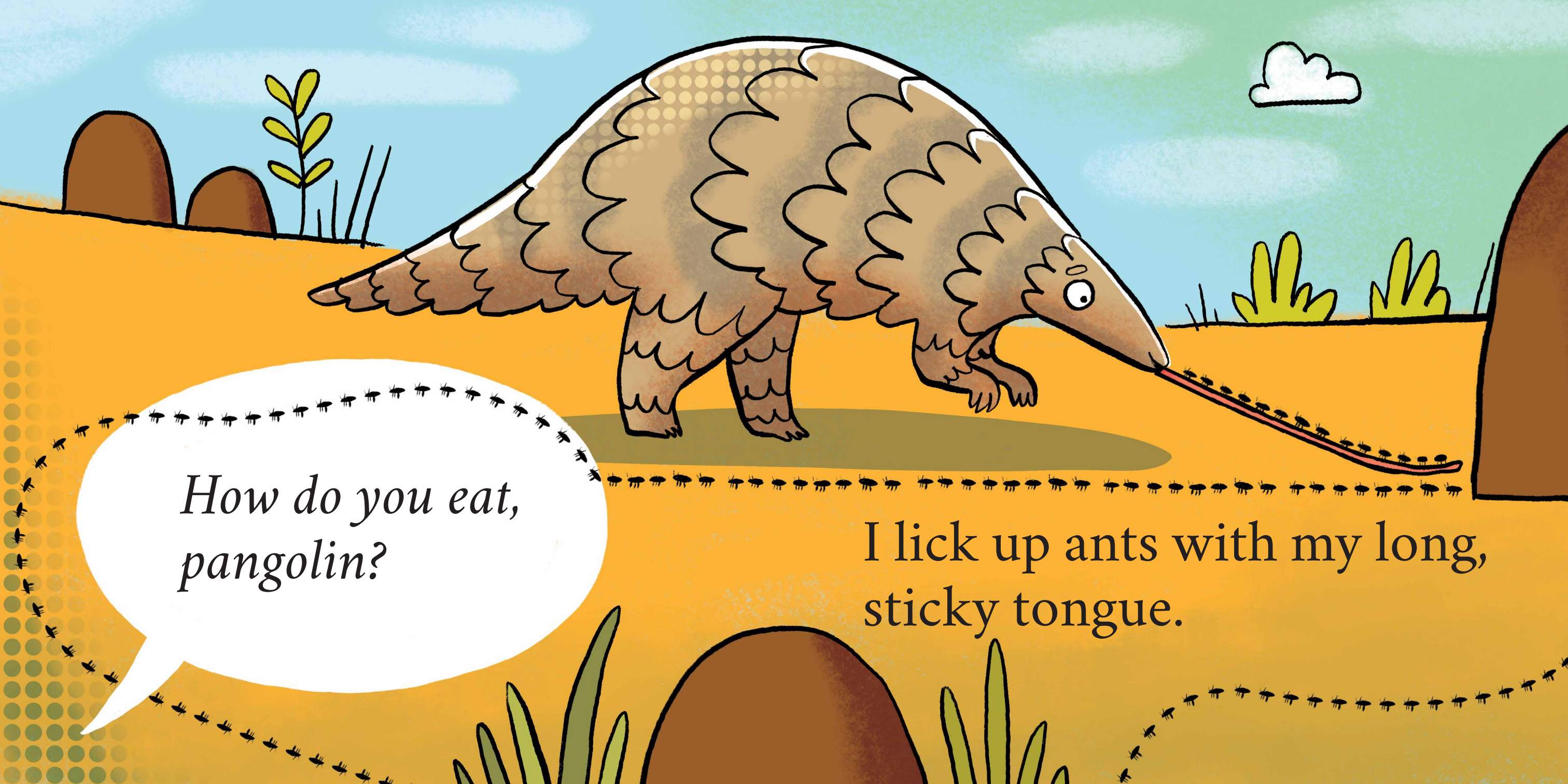
*How do you eat,

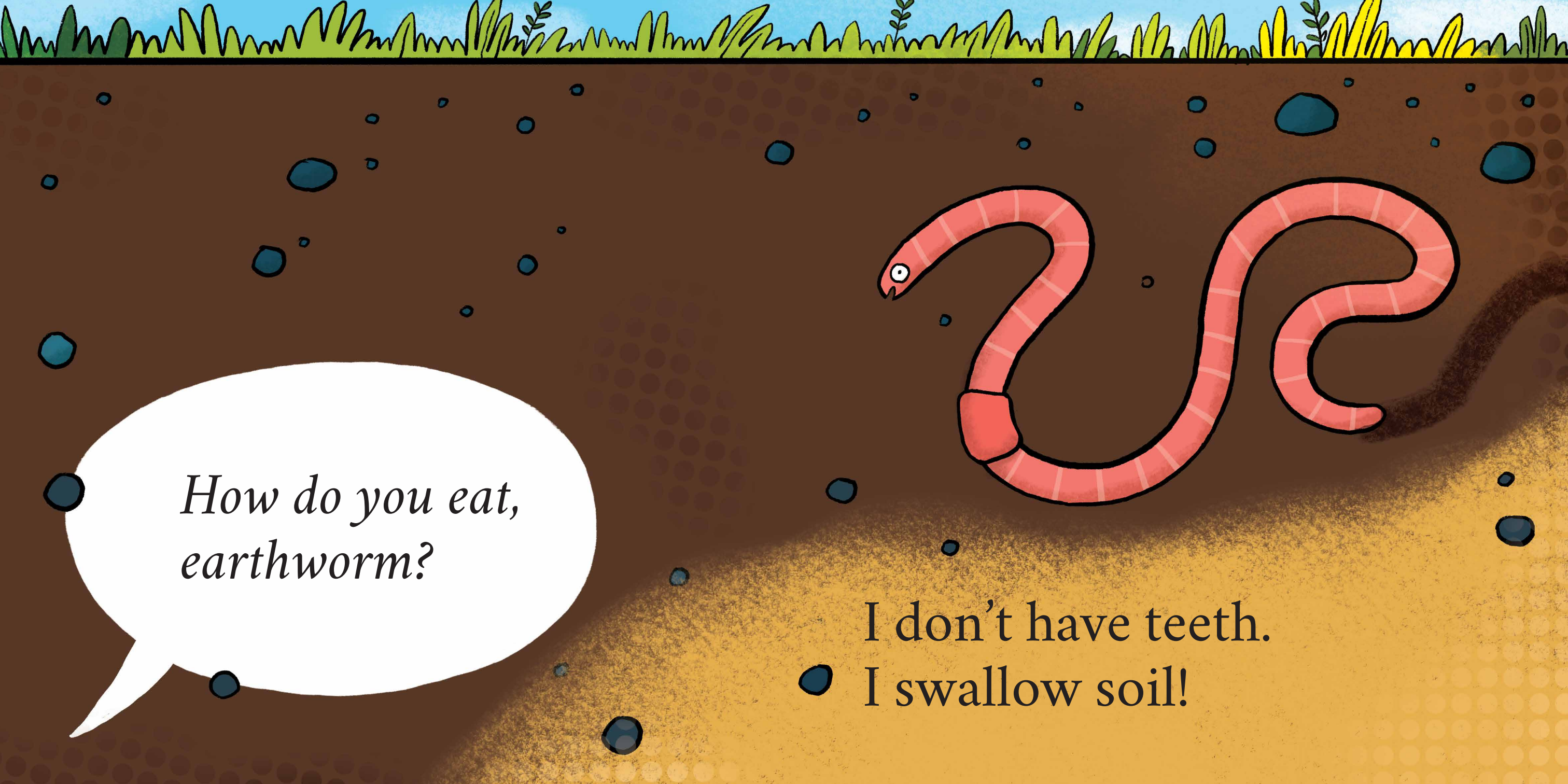
*How do you eat,

the fish!

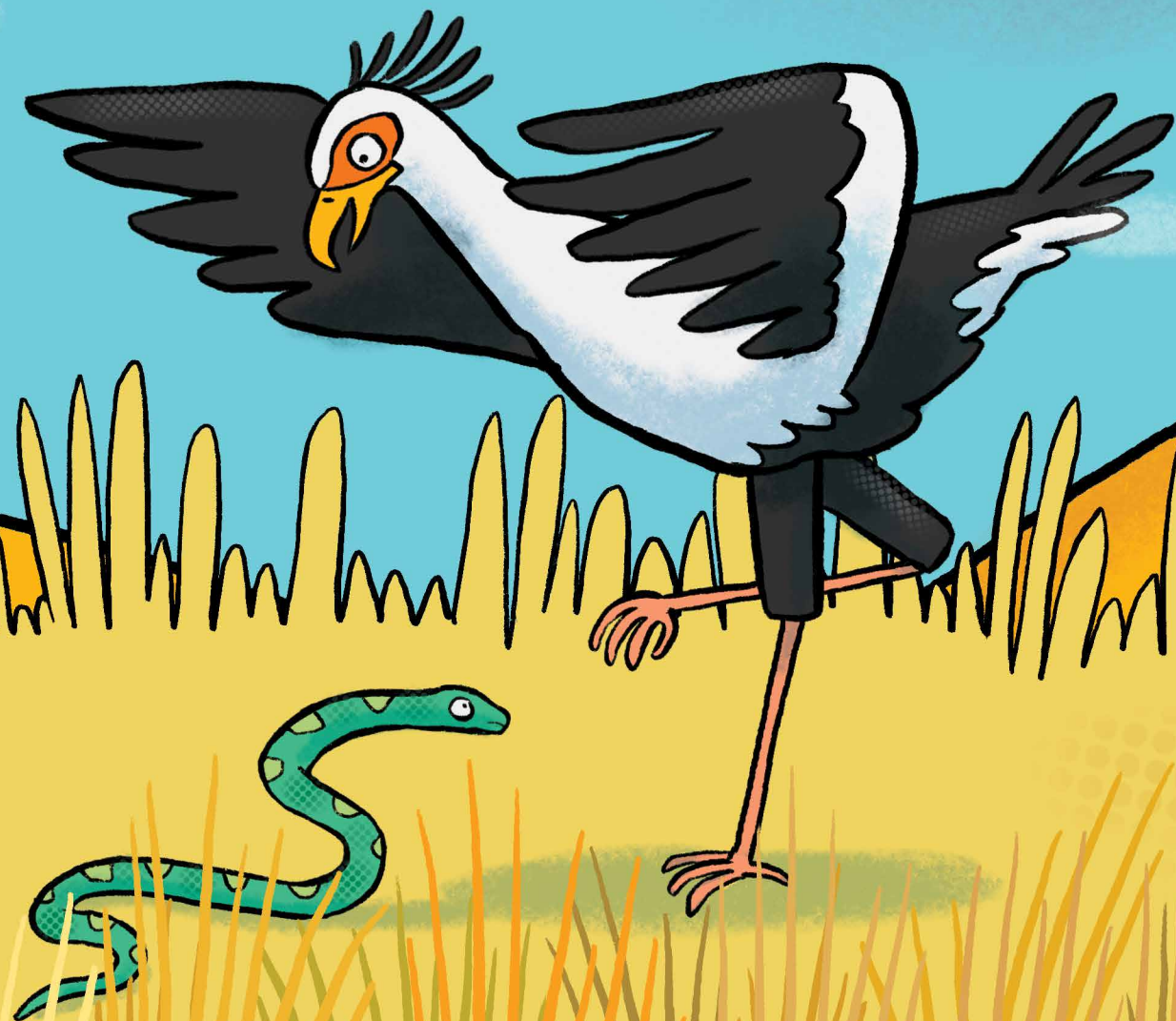
*How do you eat,
