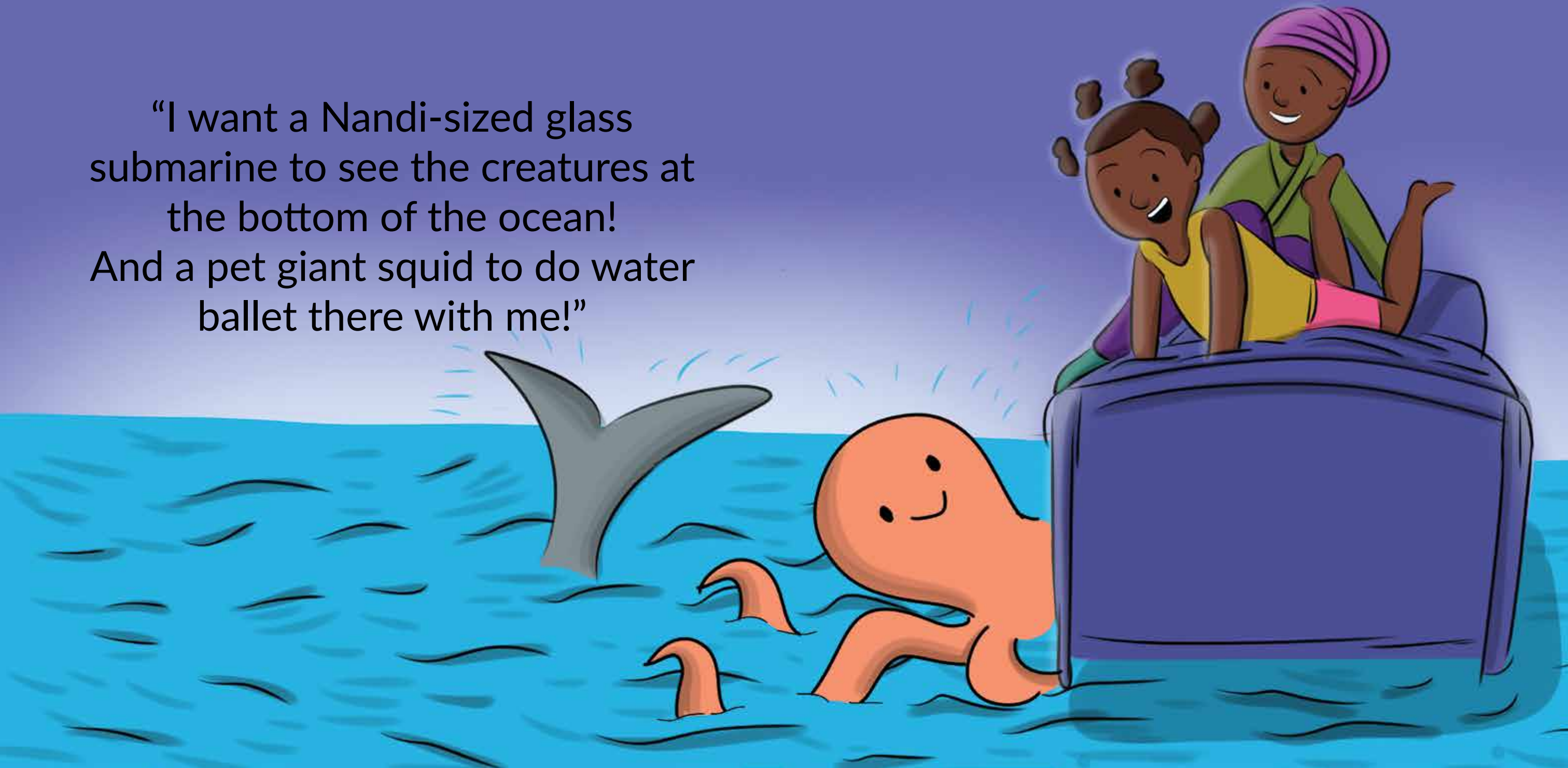
“Do you want to creep
