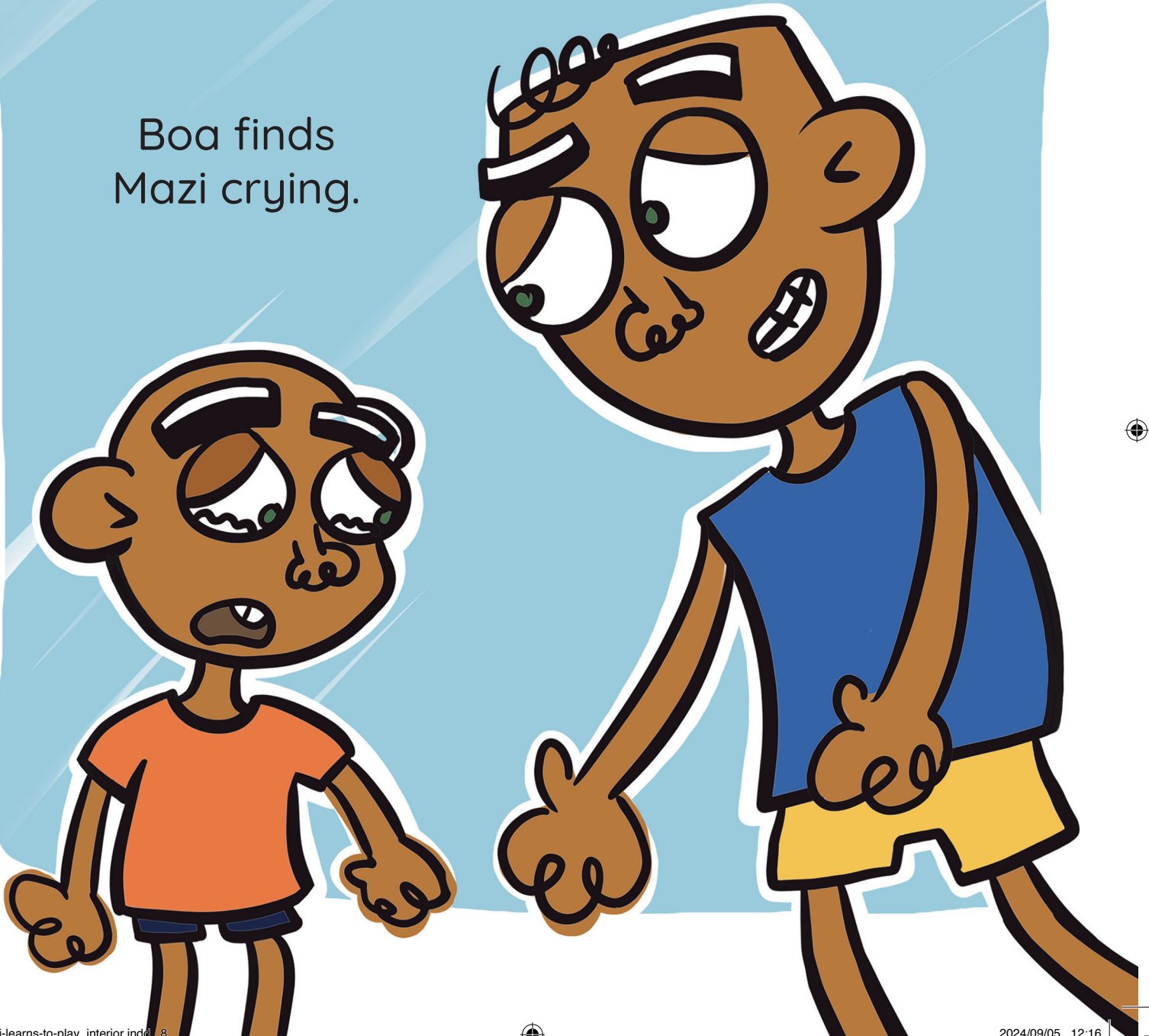
Mazi is sad.

Boa tells Mazi.



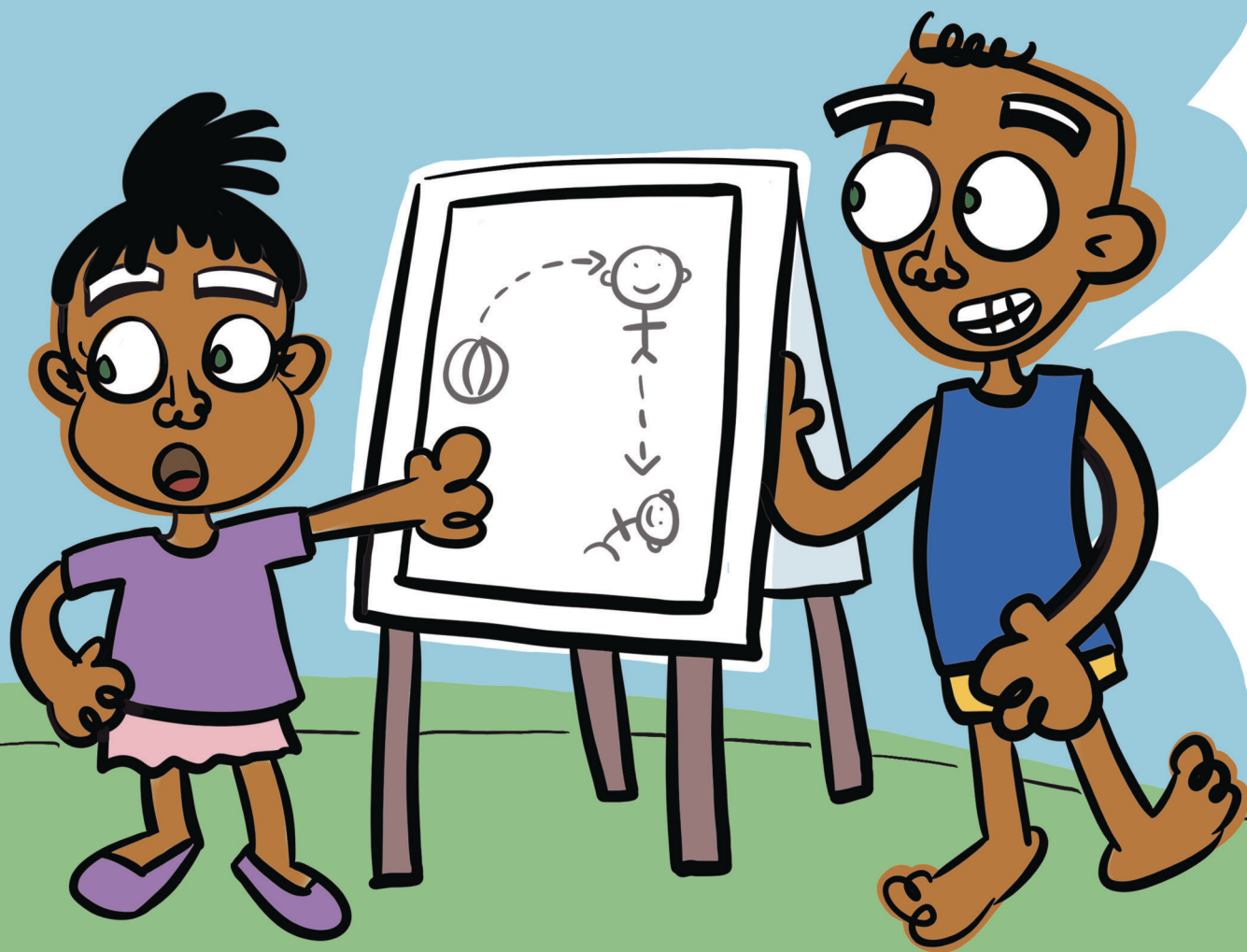
“Okay,”

to hit him with it.



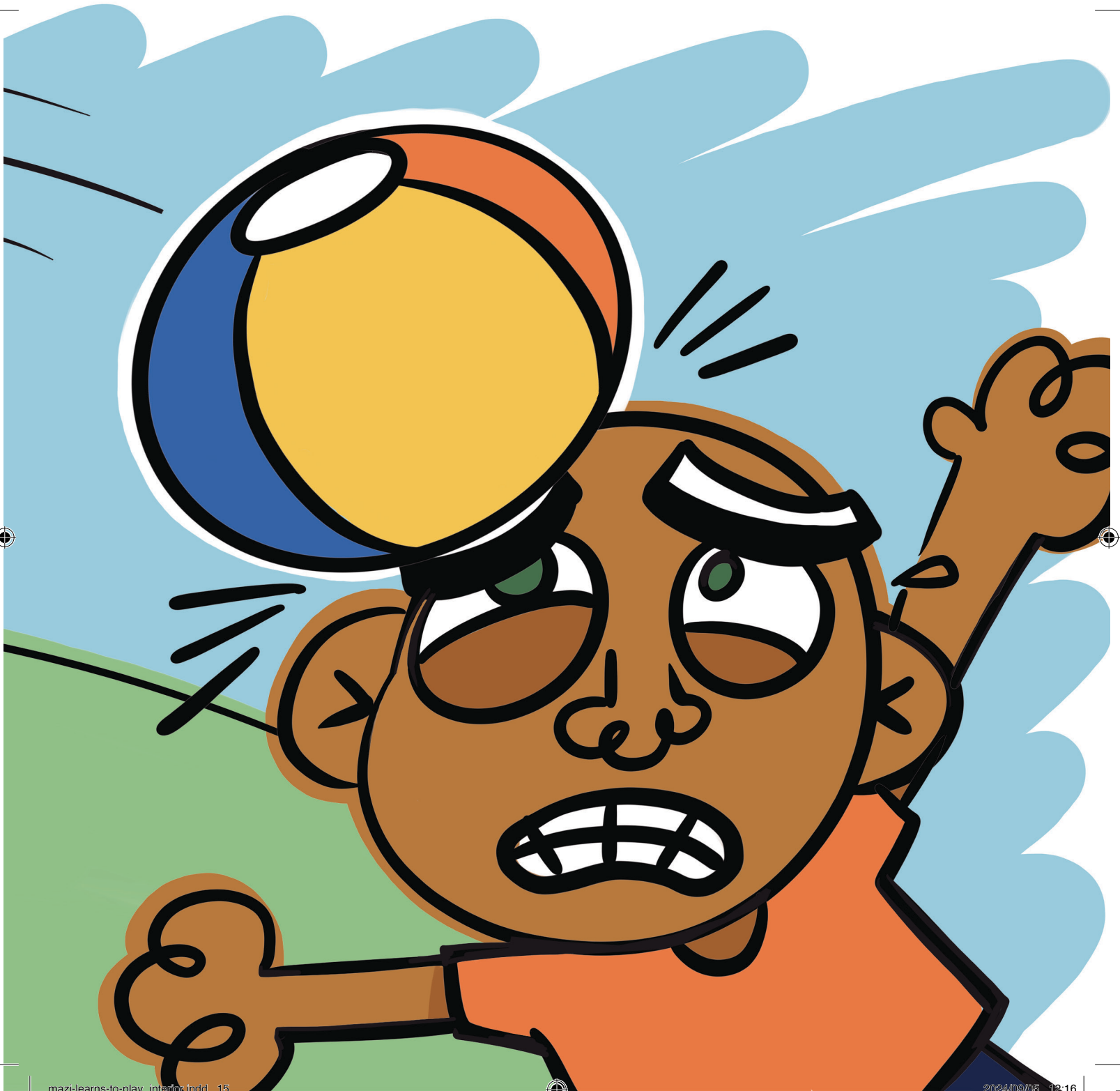




After they explain the

“Ouchiee!”

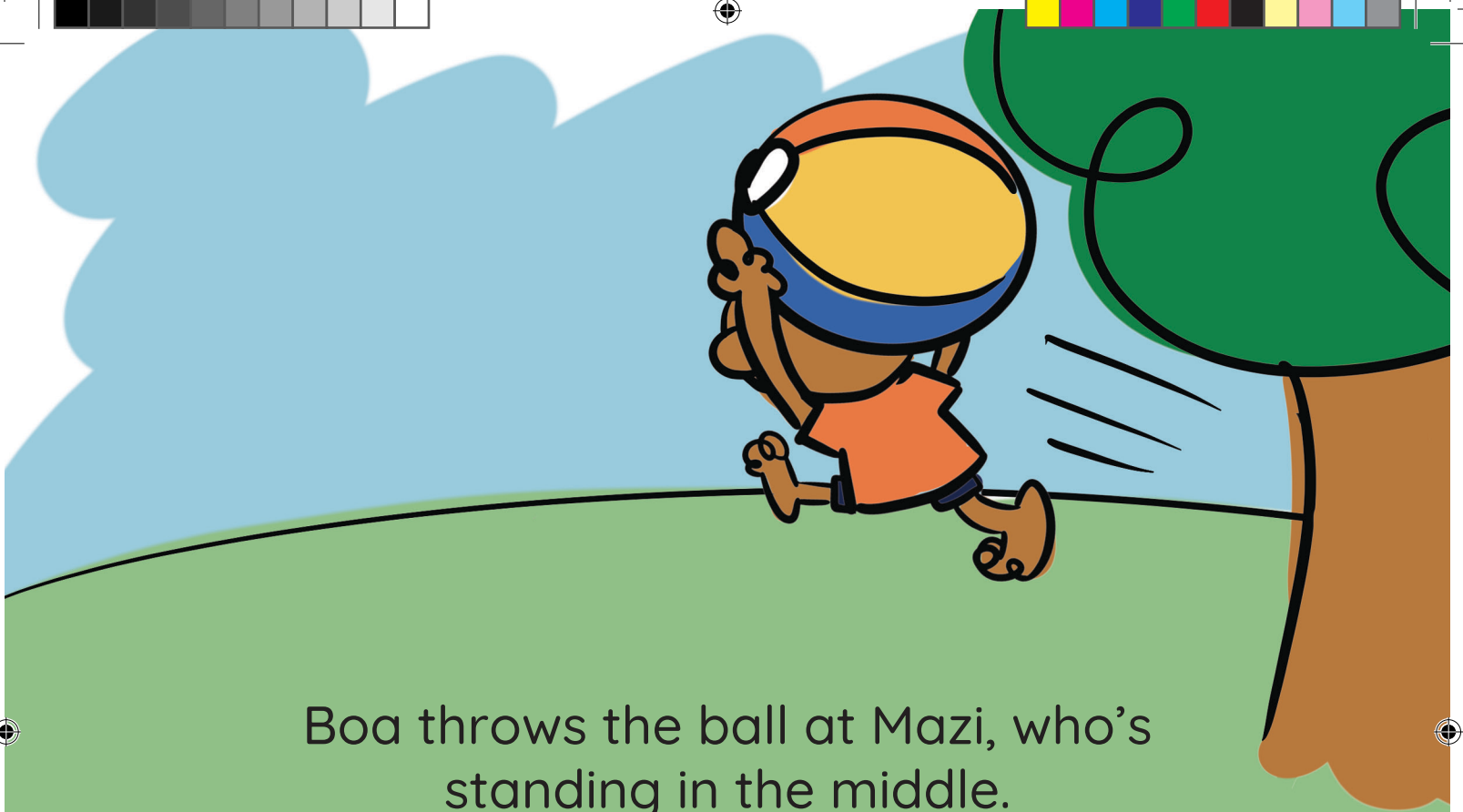
“You hit me with the ball!”

he shouts.



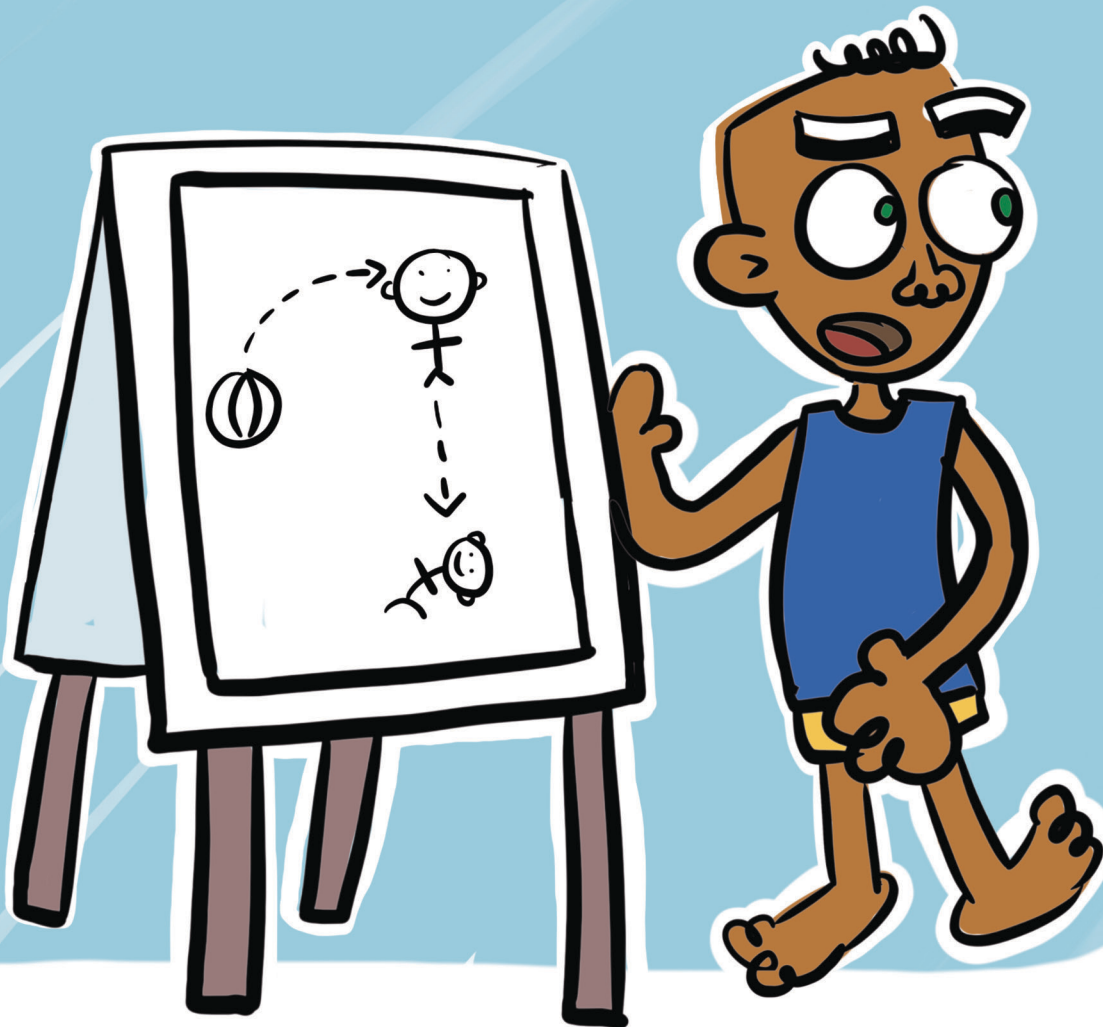


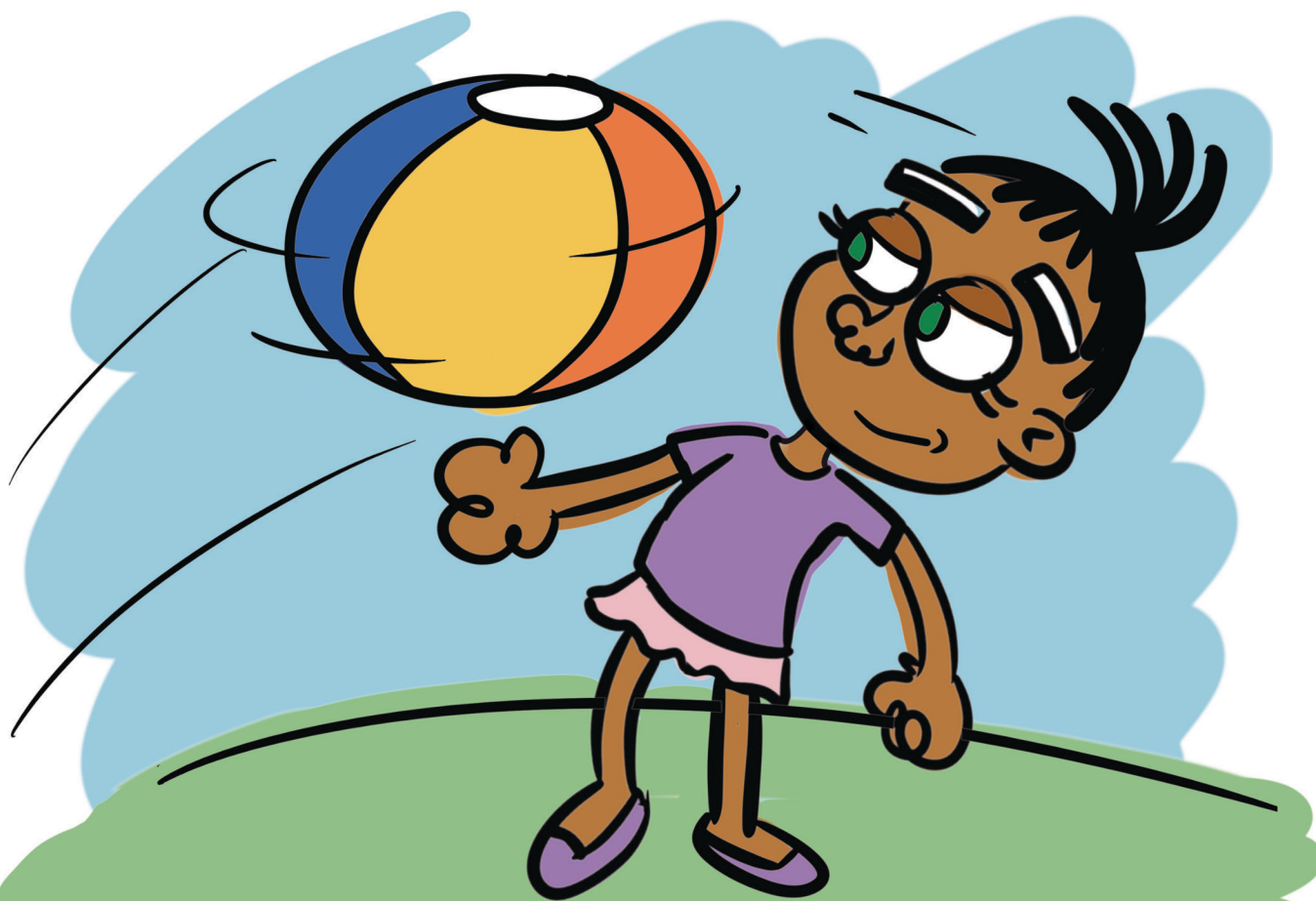
“Mazi stop!”

Boa says.

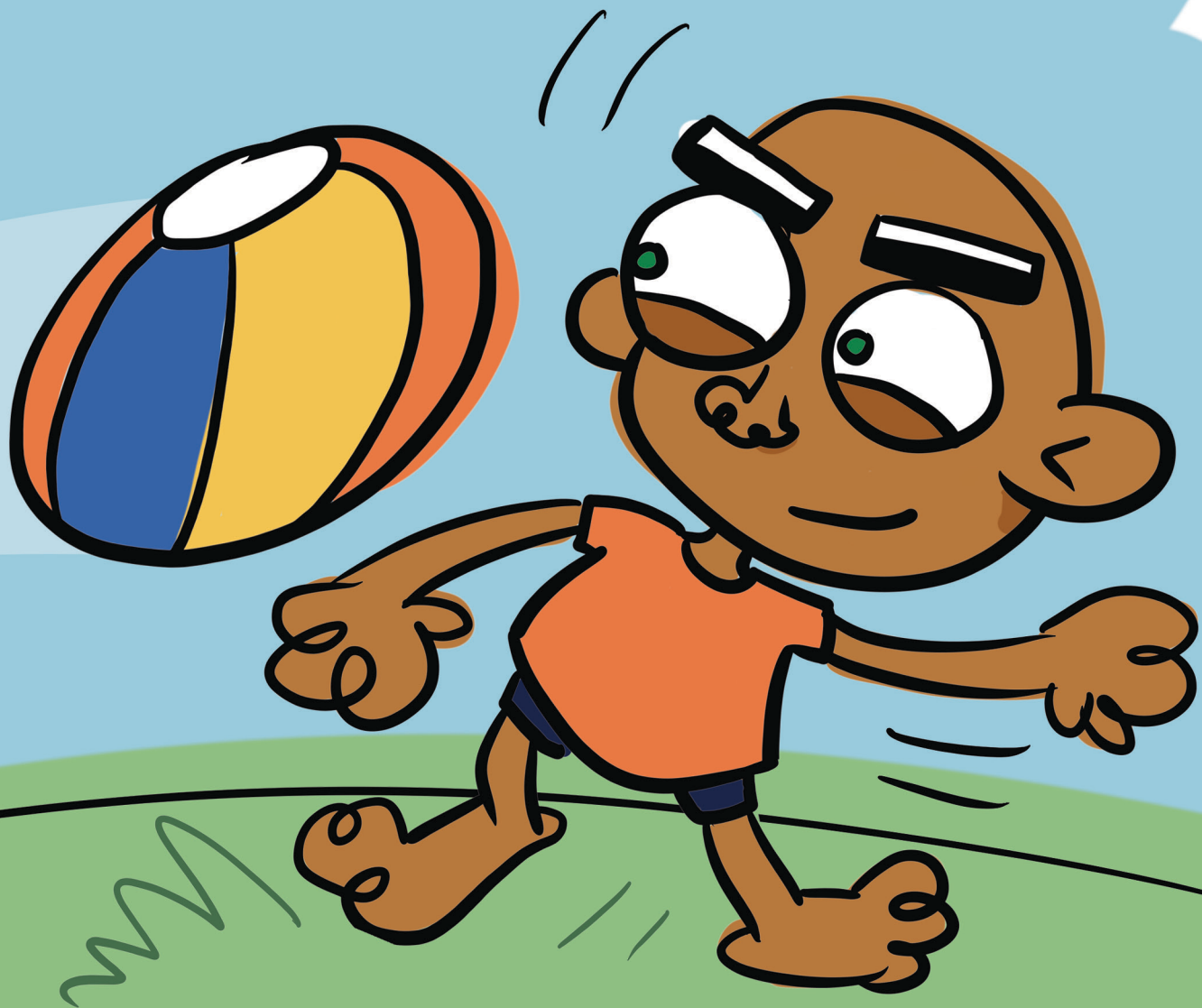
“Stand in the middle
