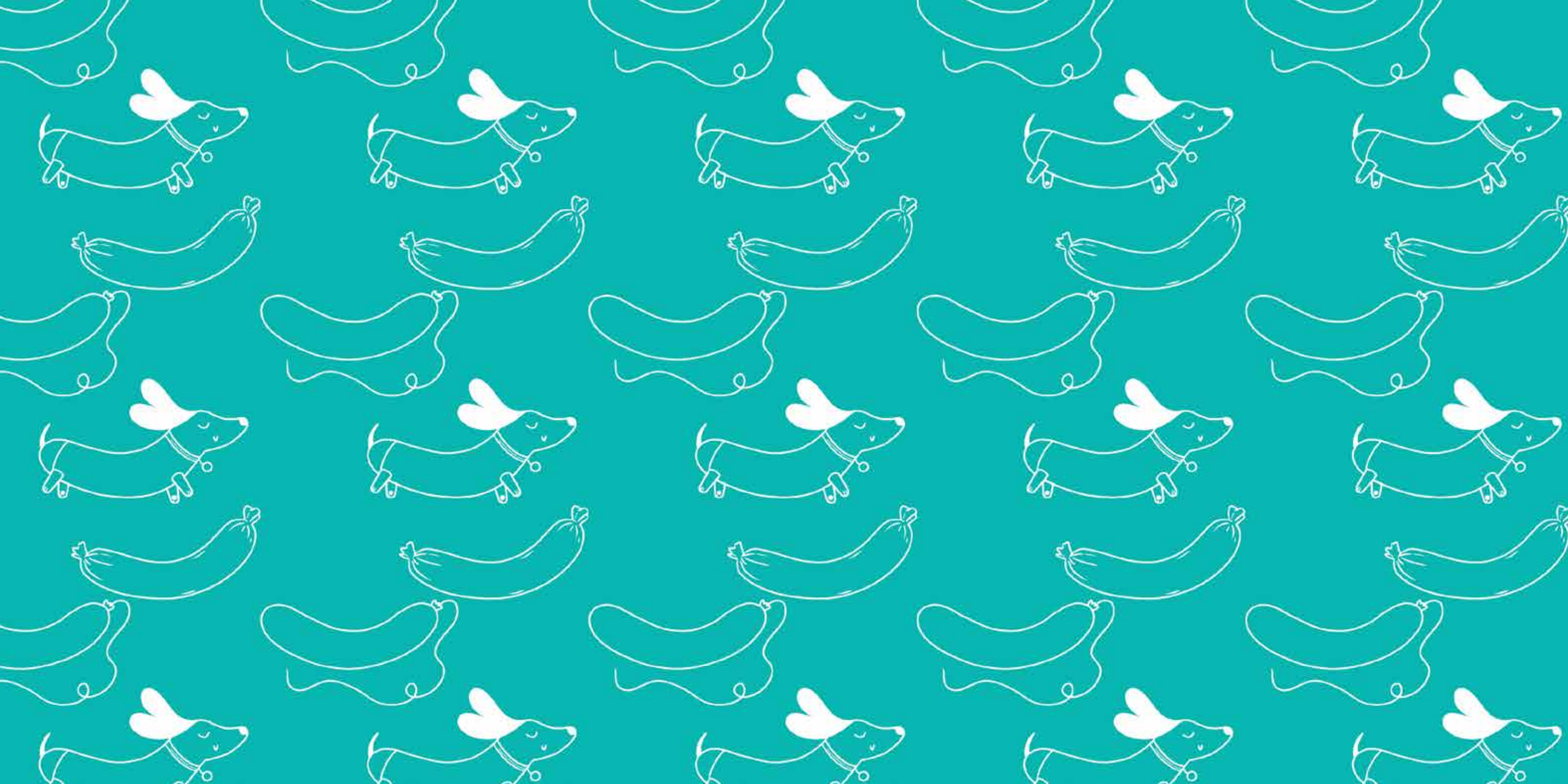

Thembsie twists and folds the balloons this way.

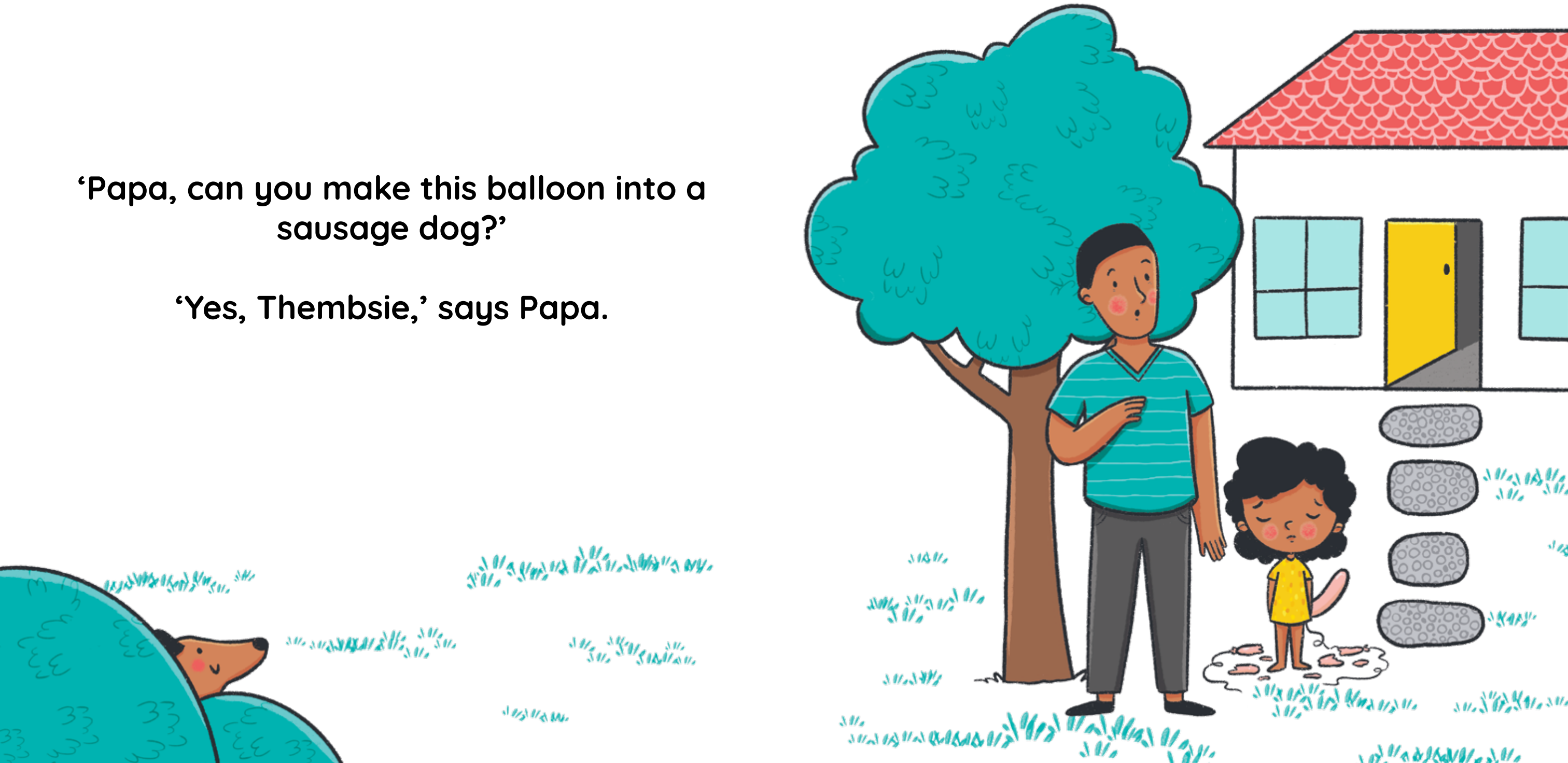


And Thembsie twists and folds the balloons that way.

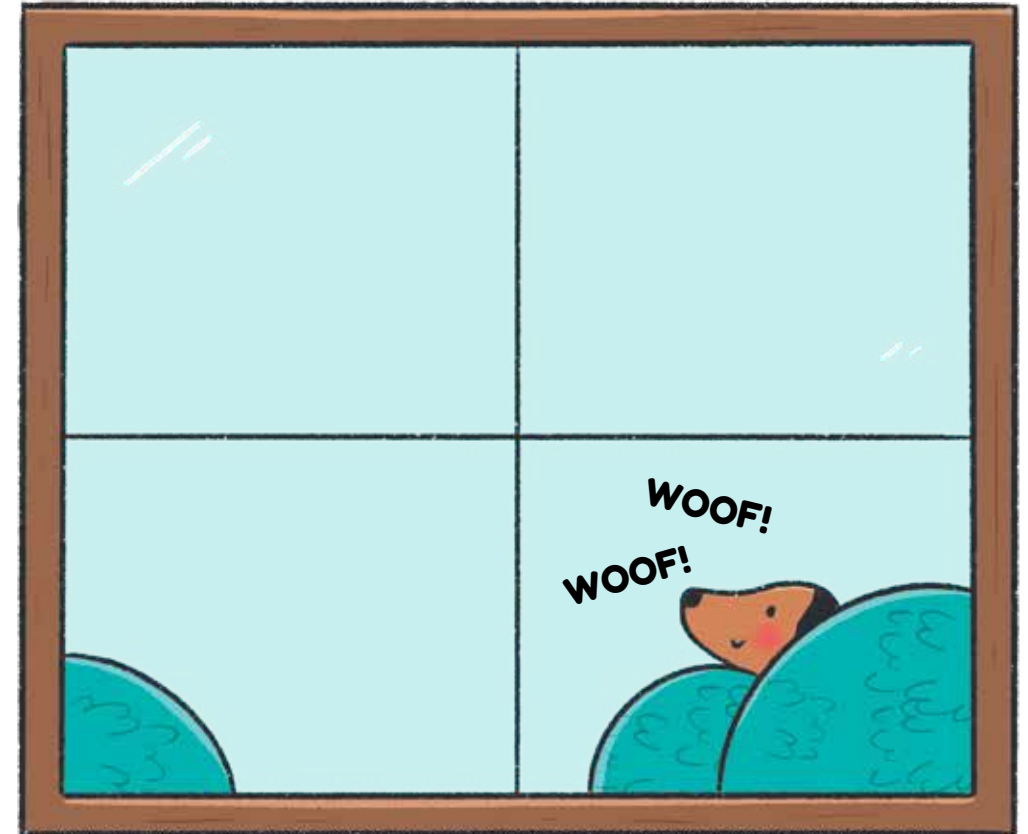


‘Papa, can you make this balloon into a

‘Yes, Thembsie,’ says Papa.



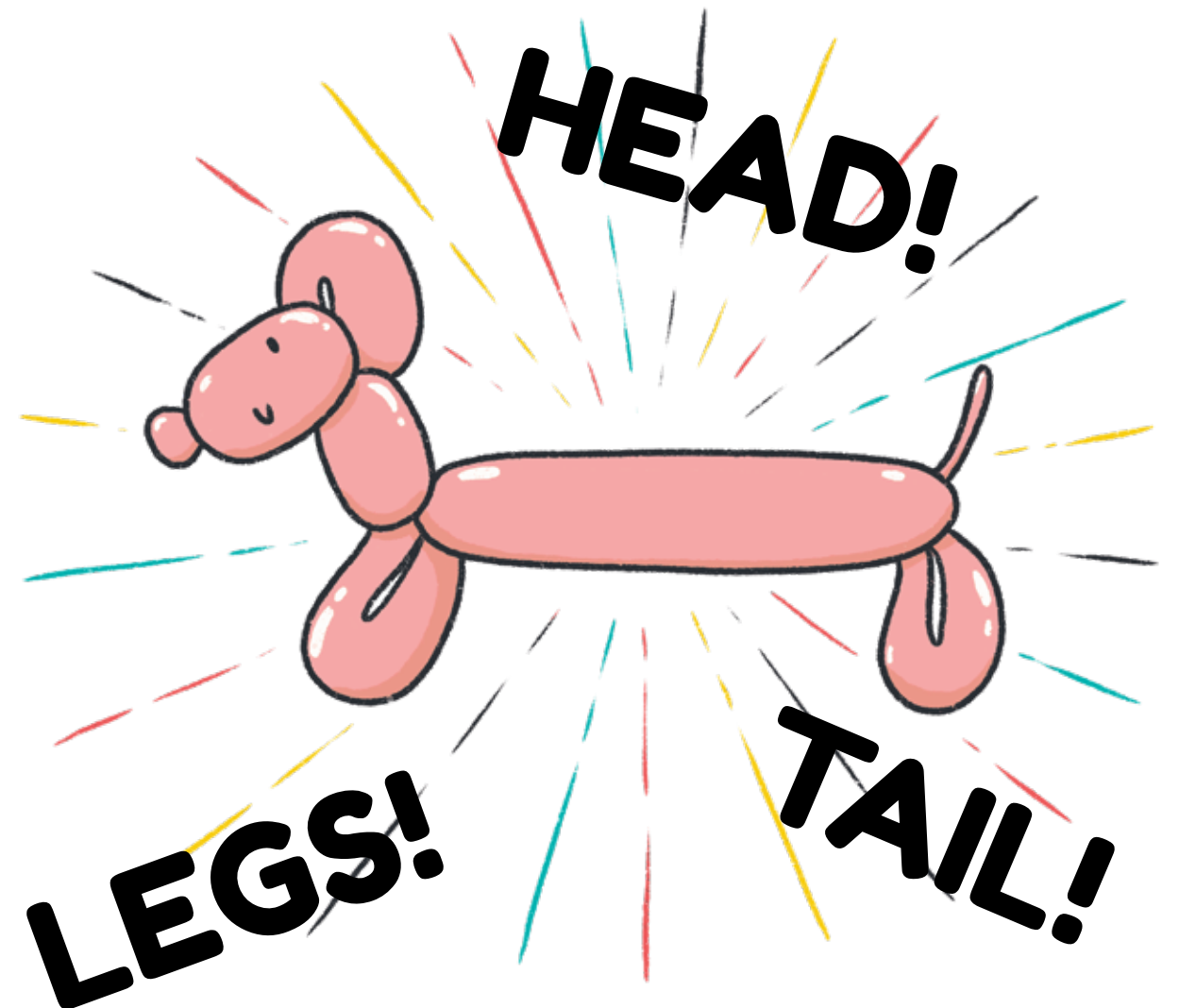
Papa and Thembsie go inside.



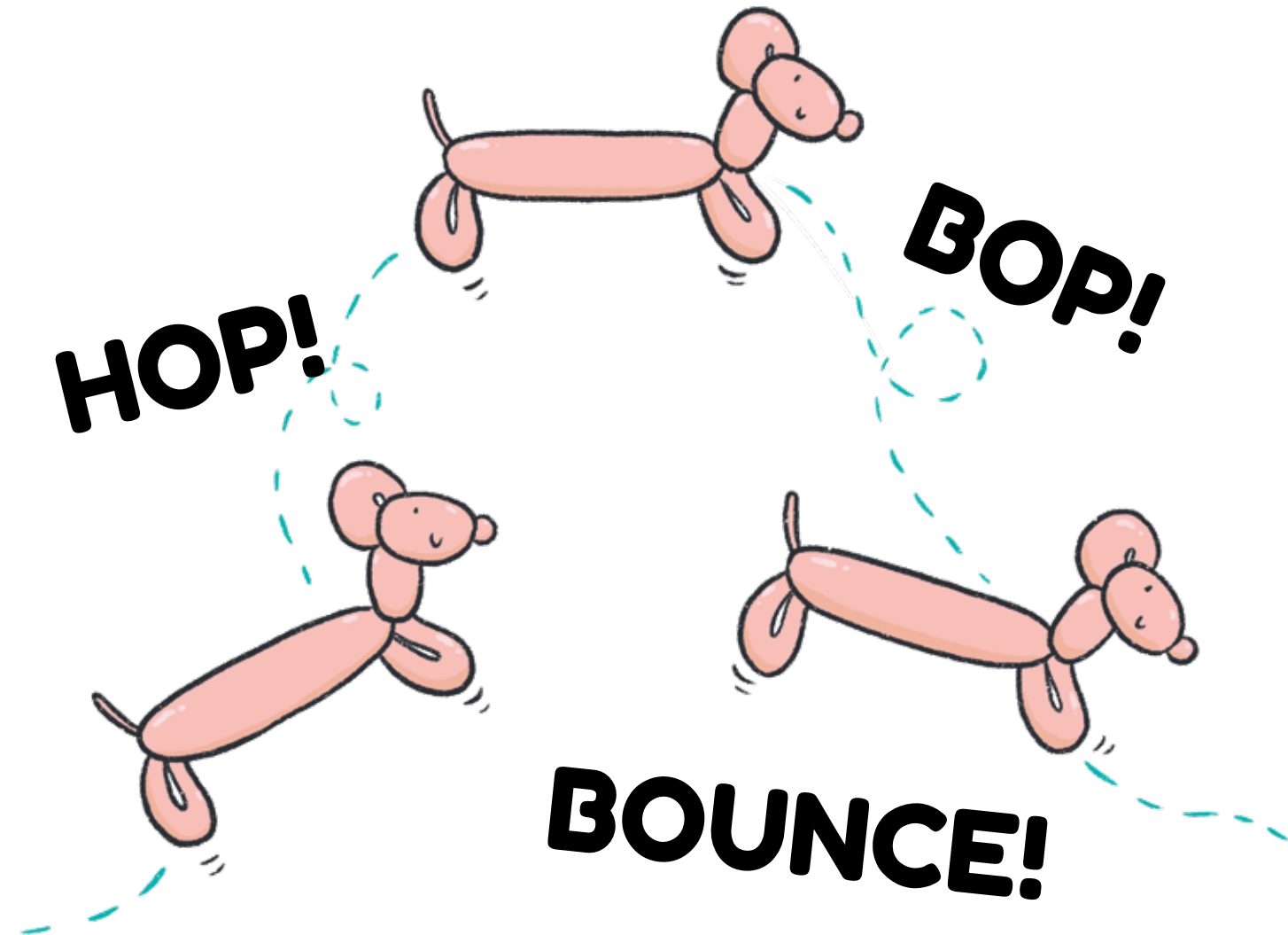
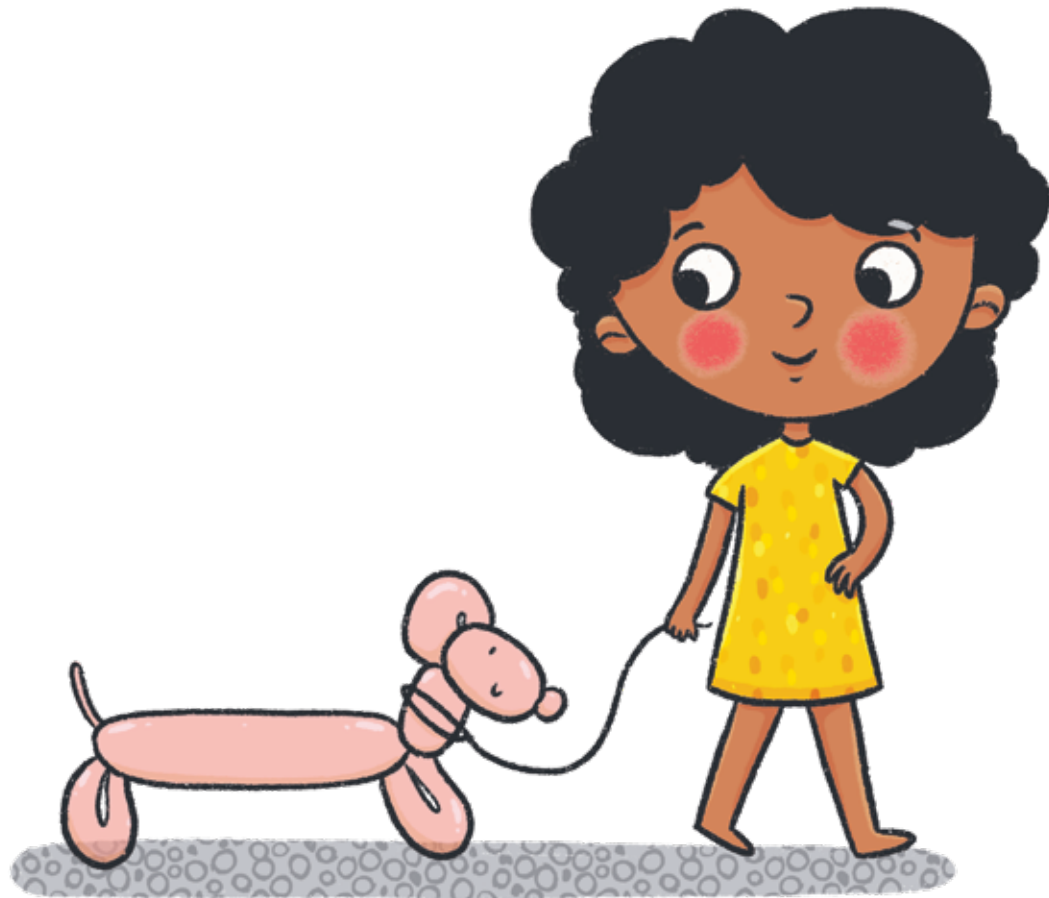
Papa twists and folds the balloon

that way.

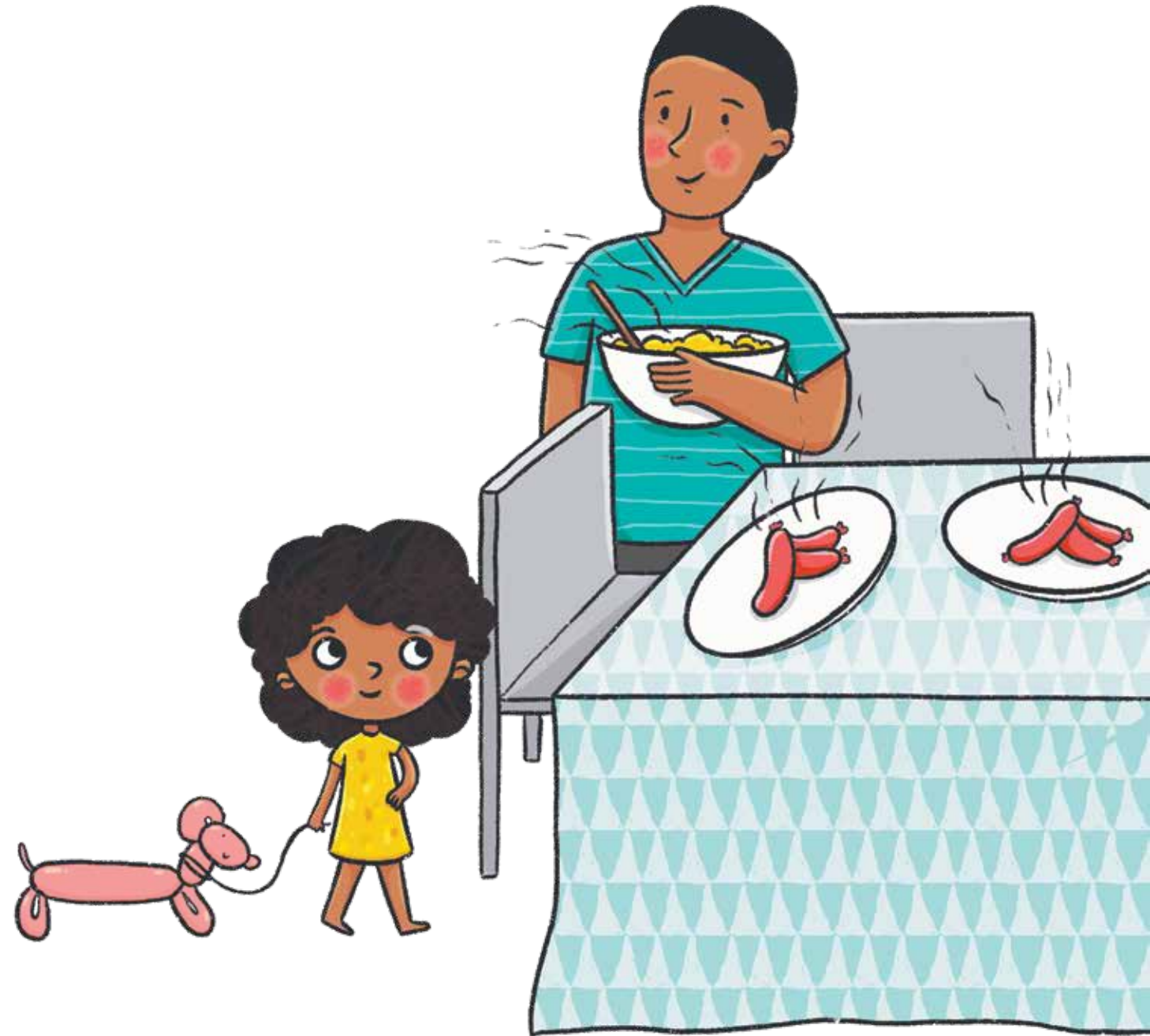


Thembsie and her sausage dog
