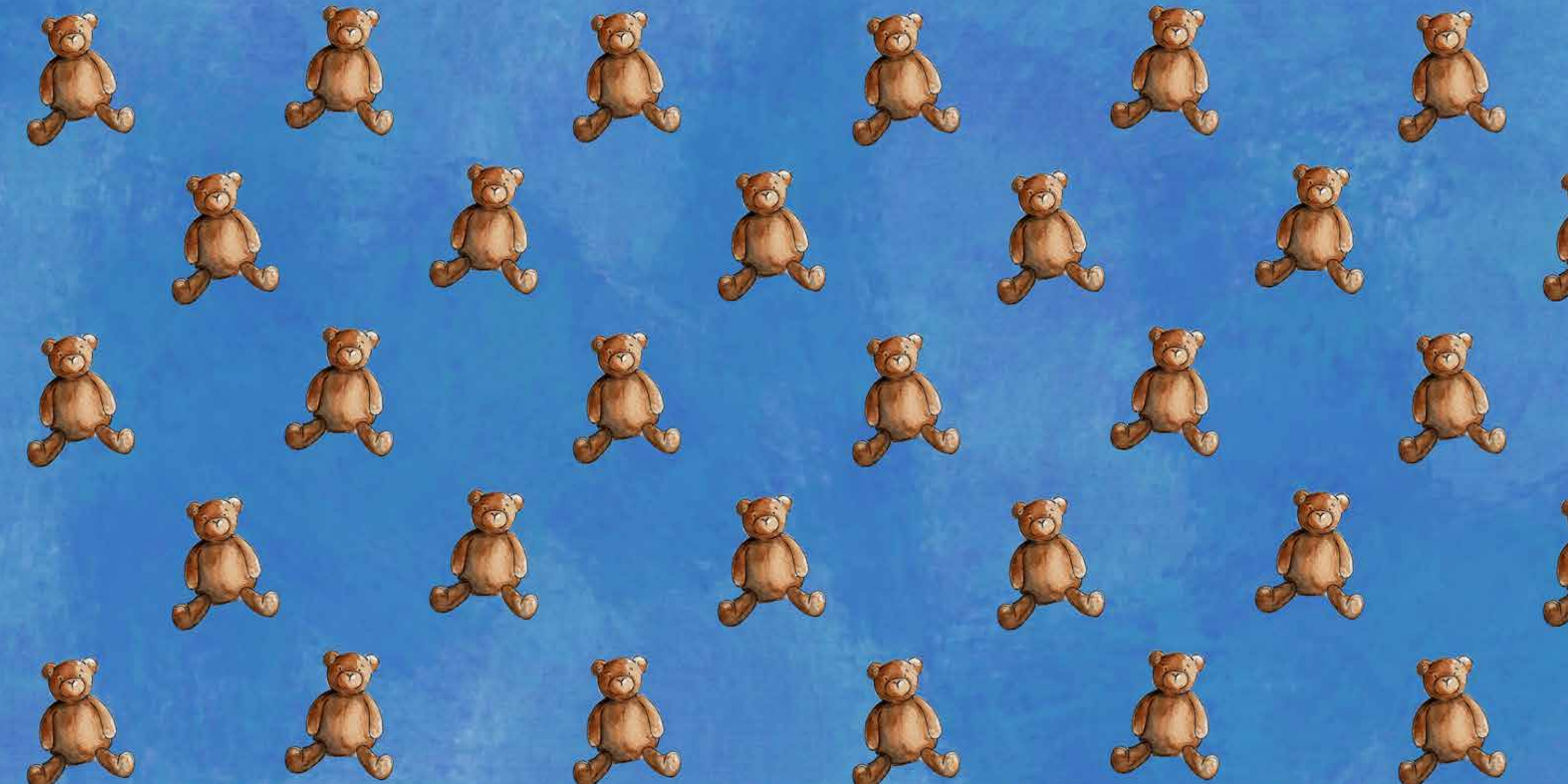

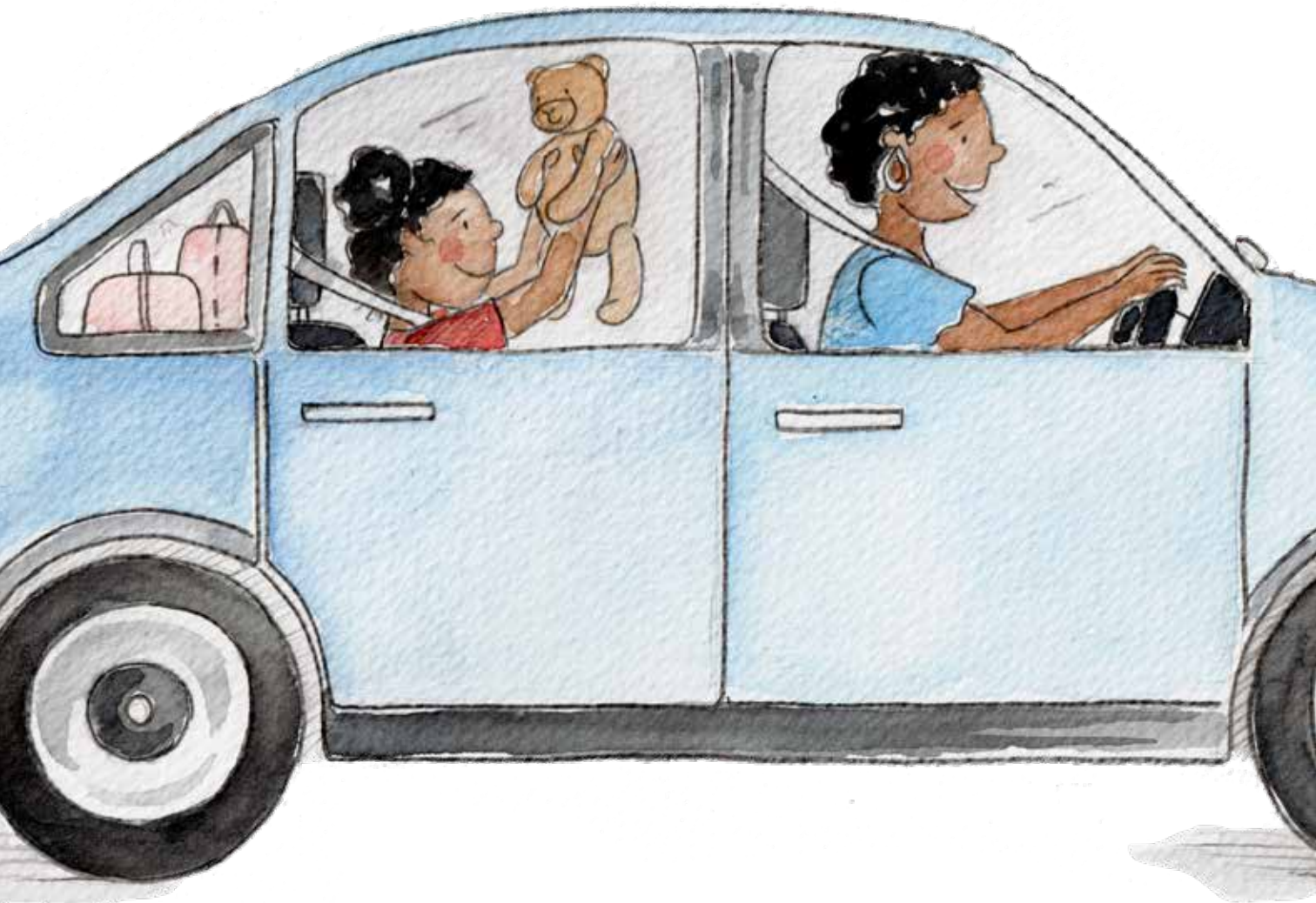
Fifi had a brown little

with her teddy bear.**



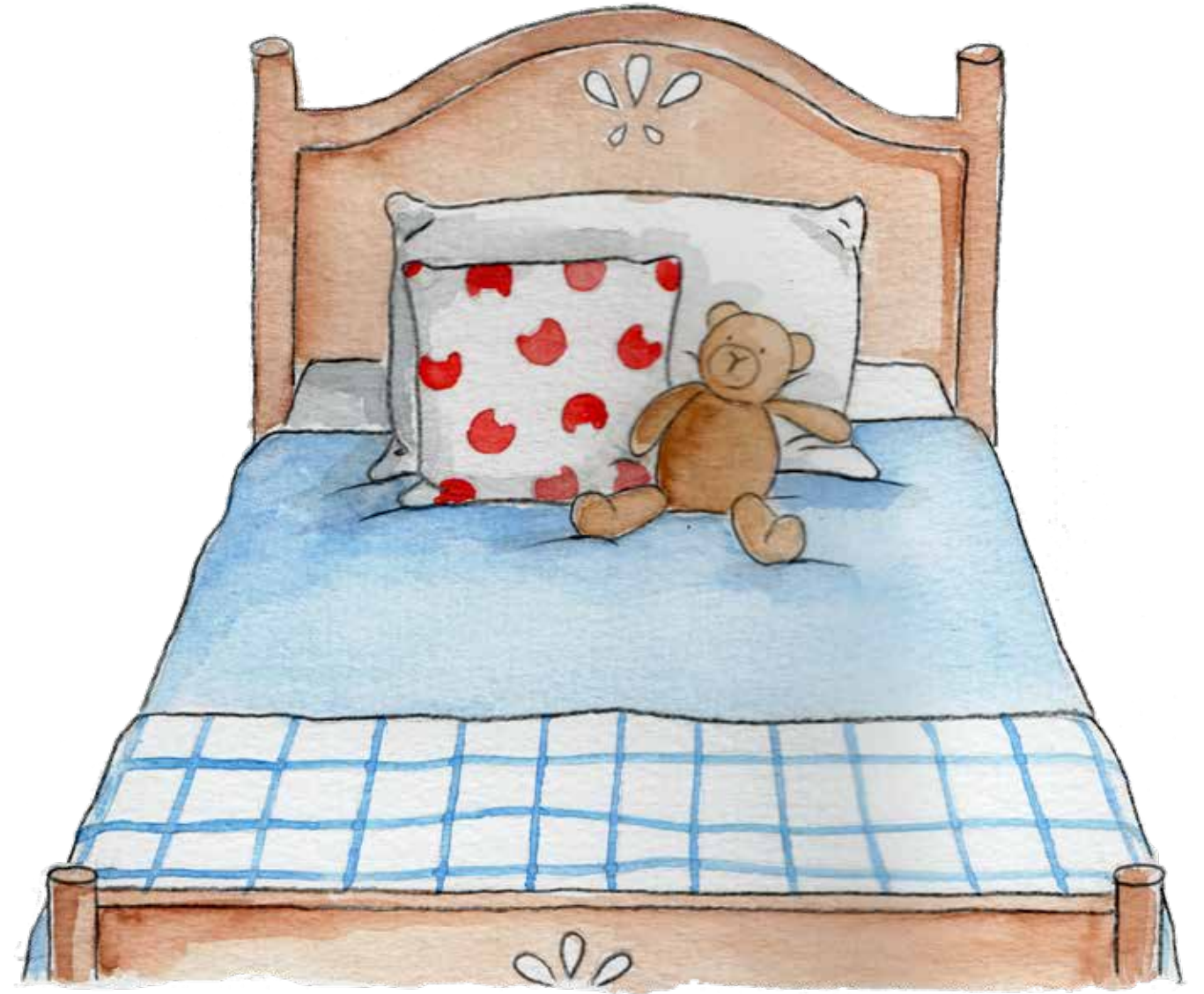
She takes her teddy bear
