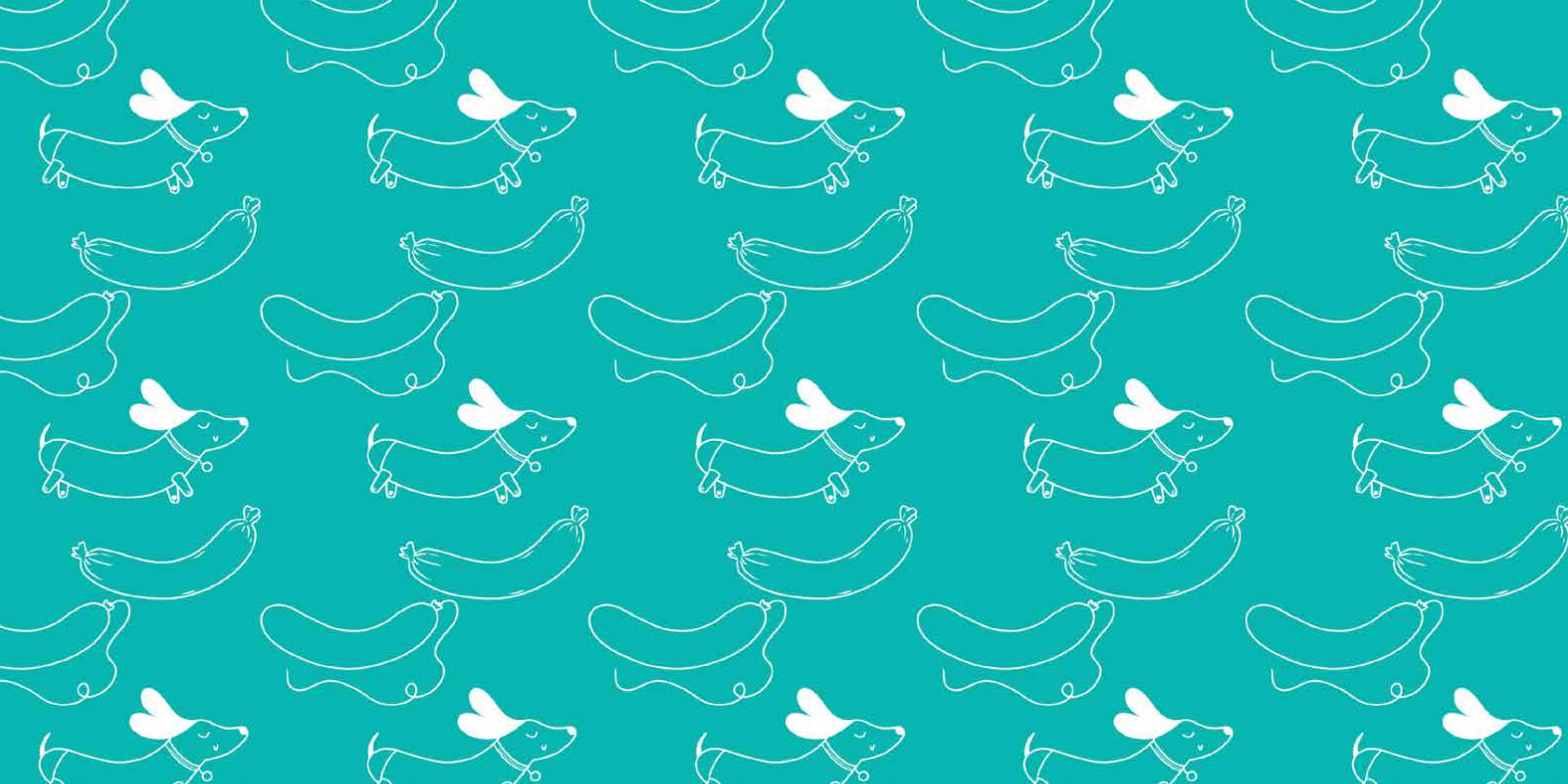

And Thembsie twists and ~~fold~~s the balloons that way.

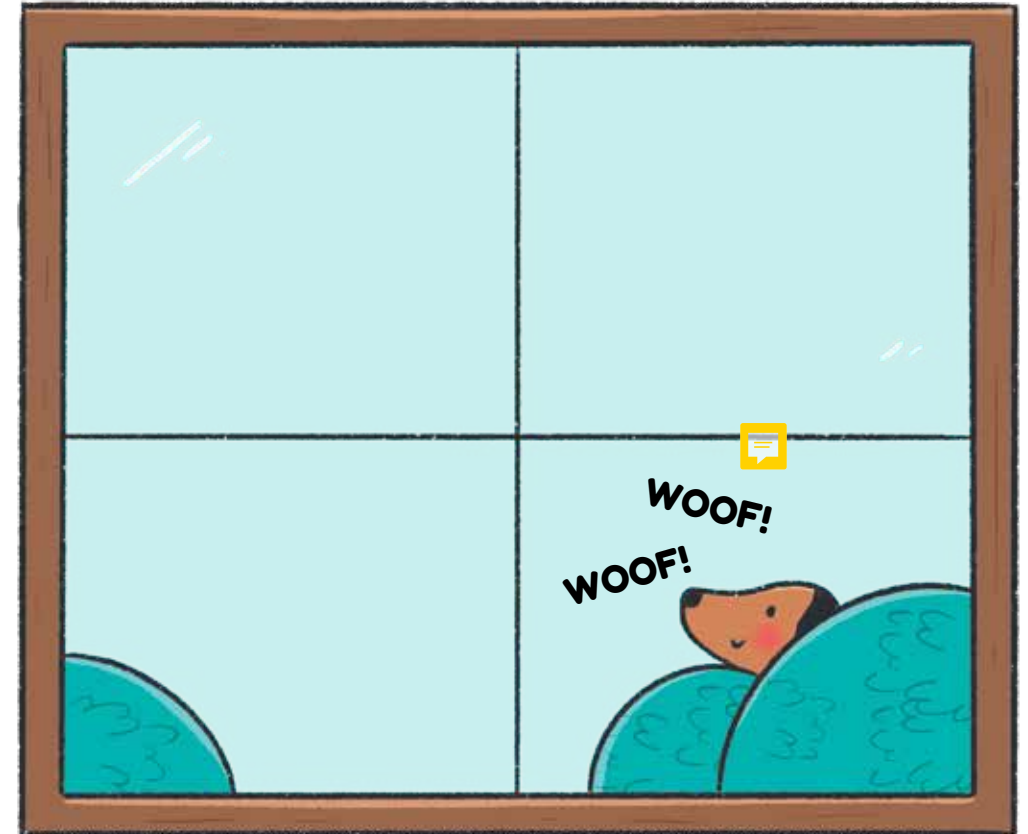


‘Papa, can you make this balloon into a

‘Yes, Thembsie,’ ~~says Papa.~~



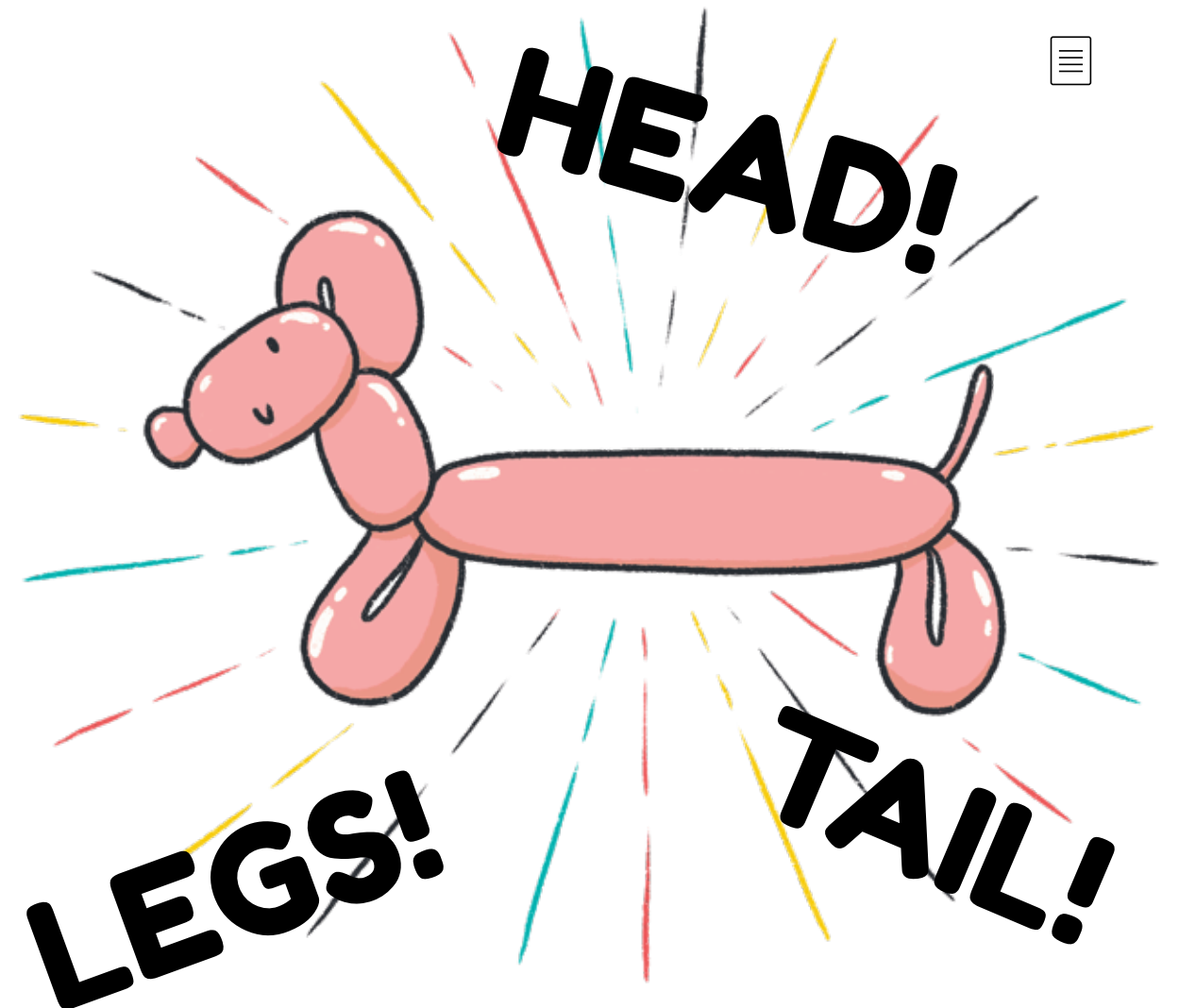
Papa and Thembsie go inside.



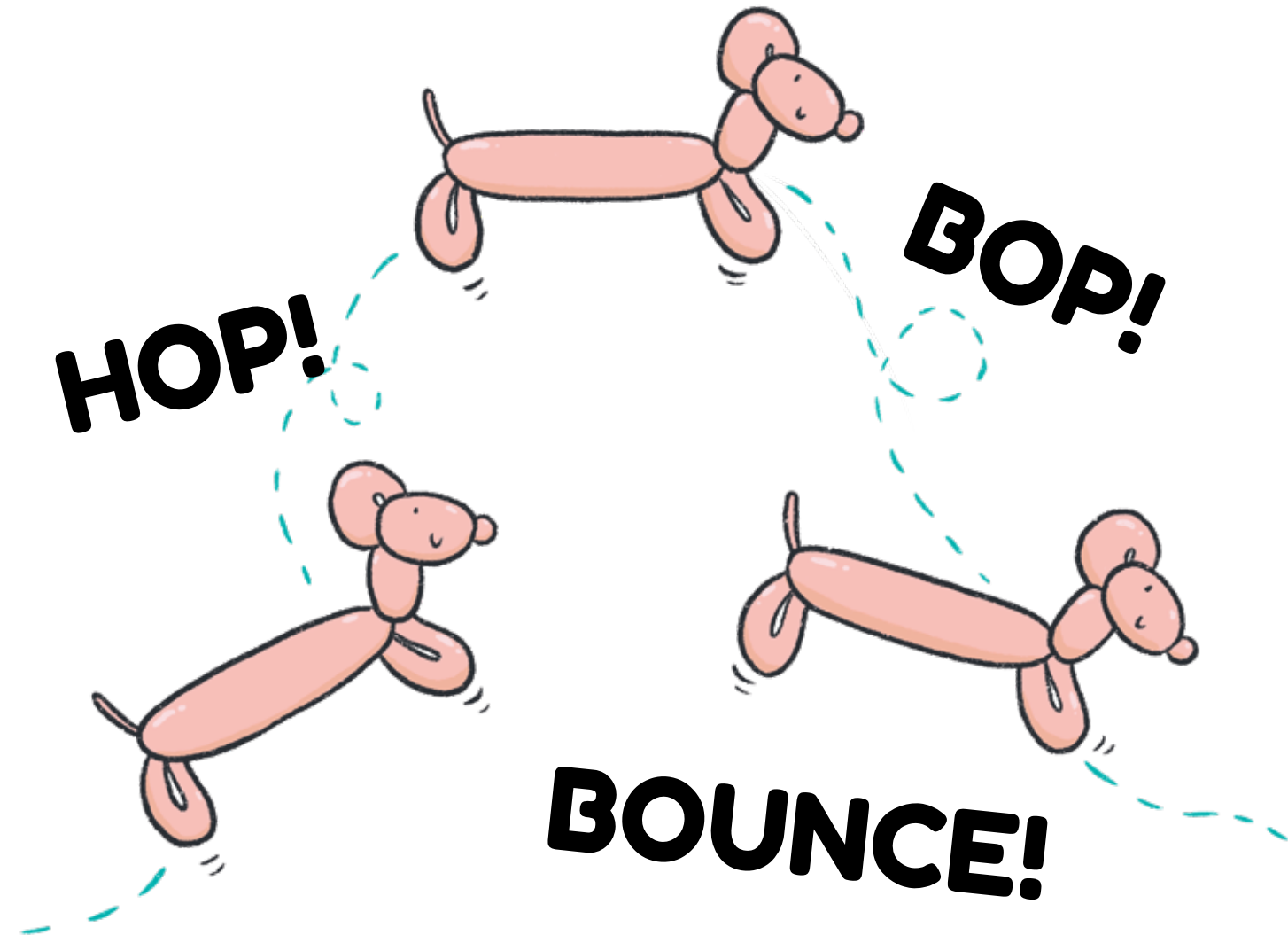
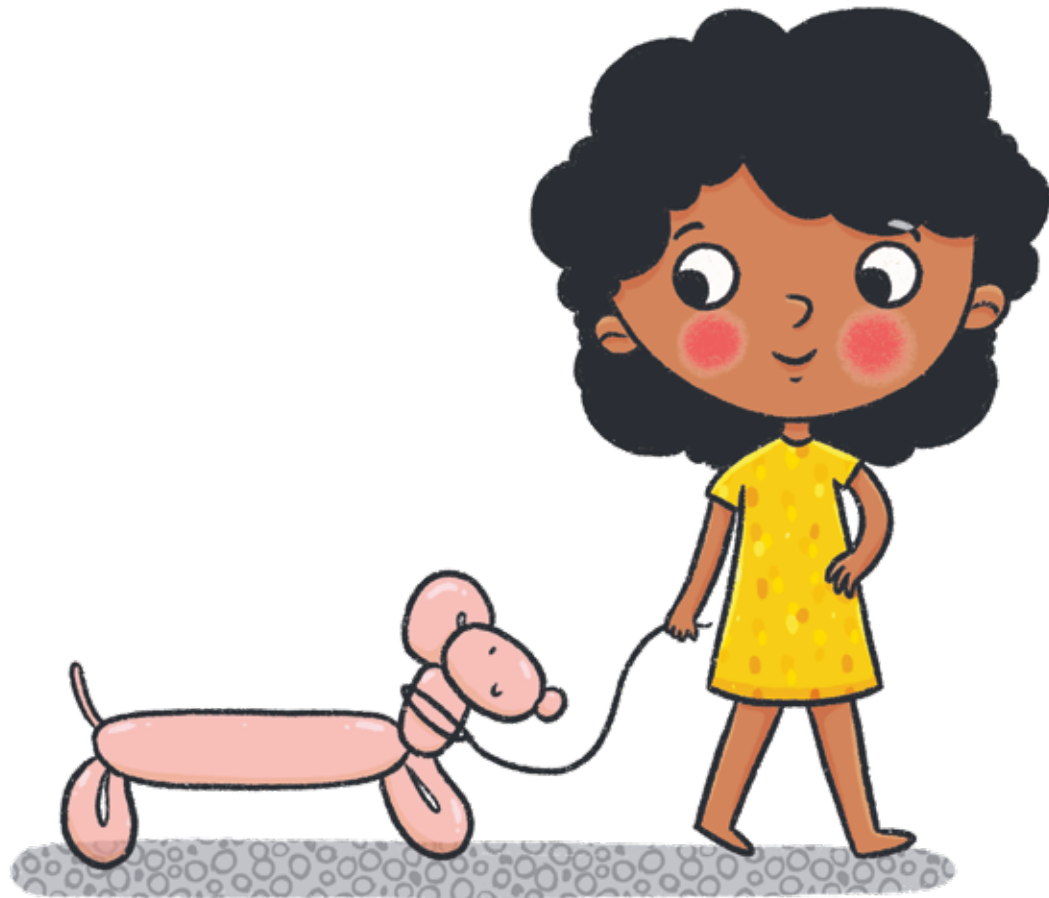
Papa twists and folds the balloon this way.



And Papa twists and folds the balloon that way.

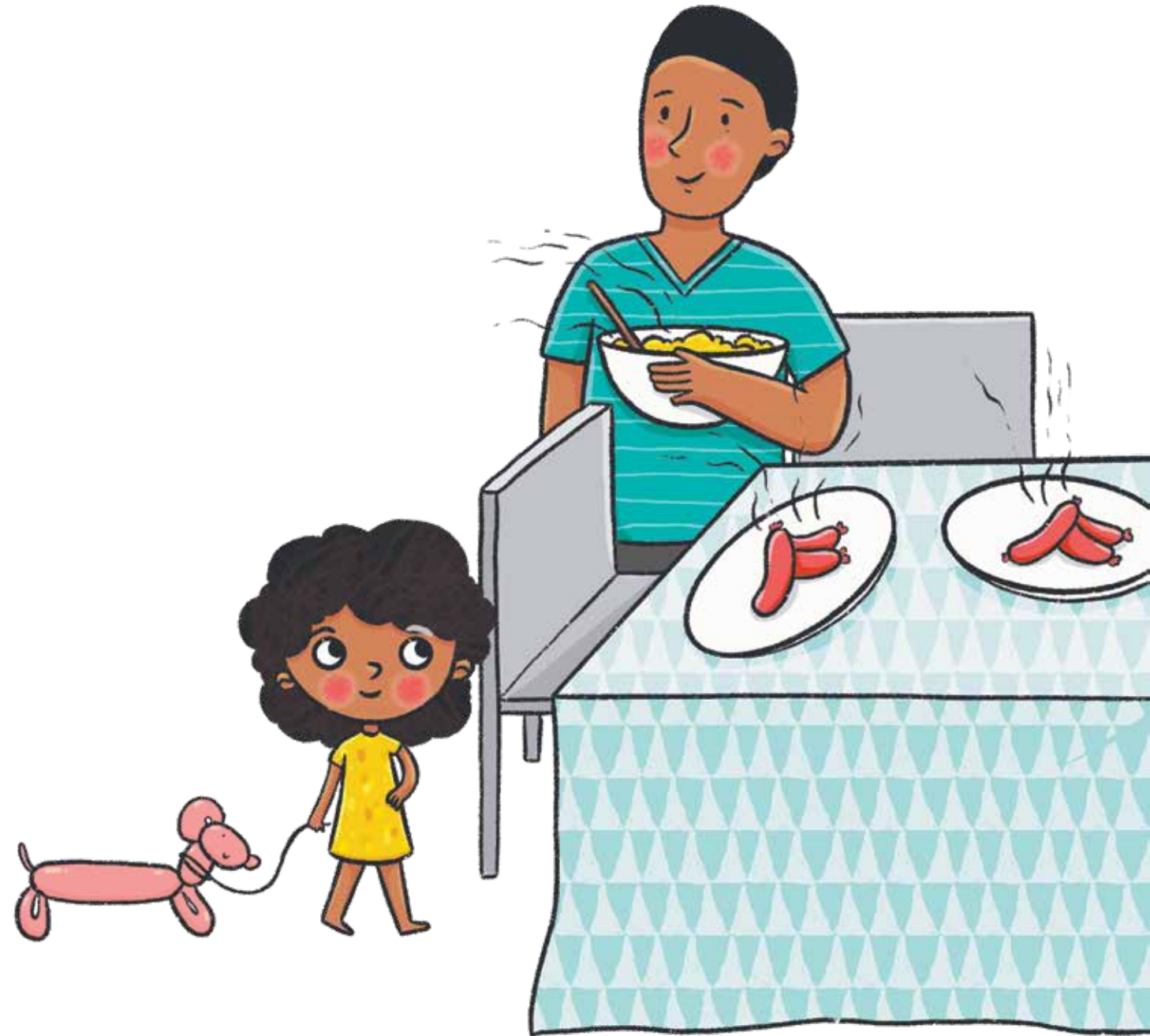


Thembsie and her sausage dog
