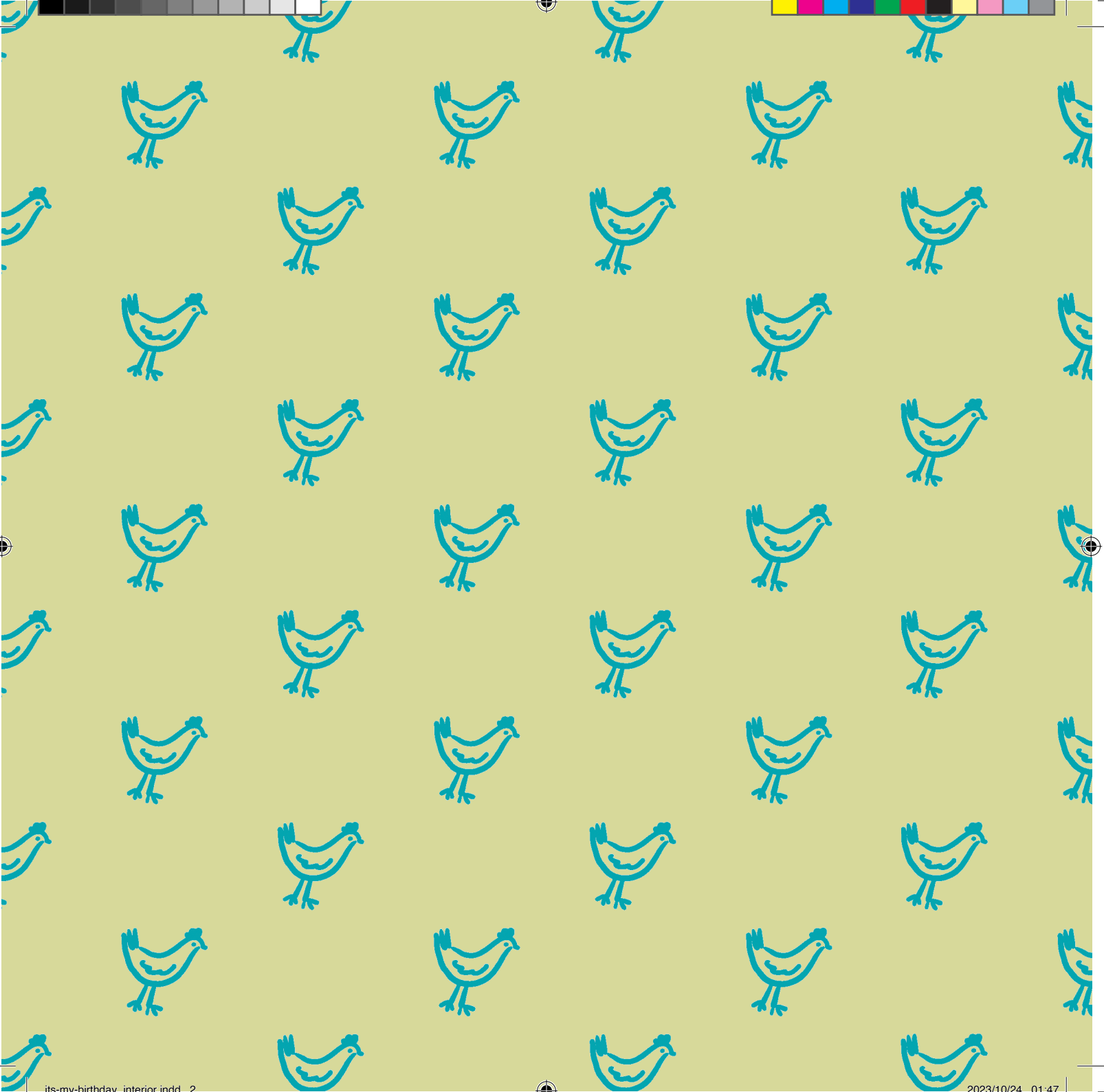

and get ready.”



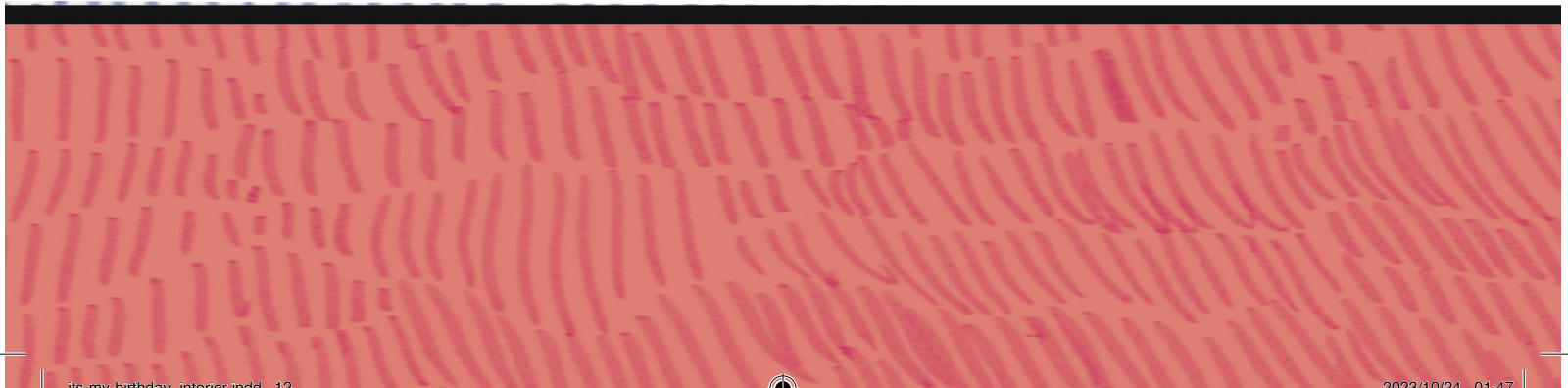


You can't be late on

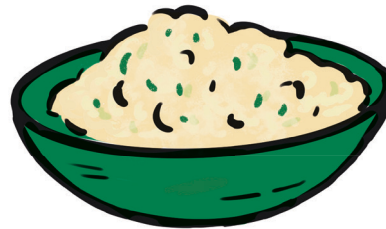
At preschool everyone knows

love notes.





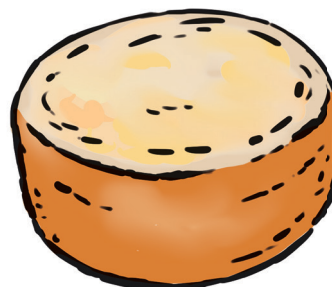
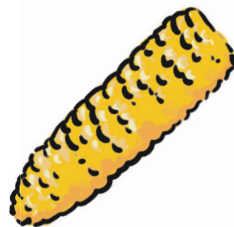
I can't wait for my special

All my friends laugh.





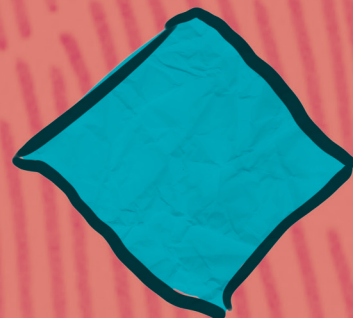
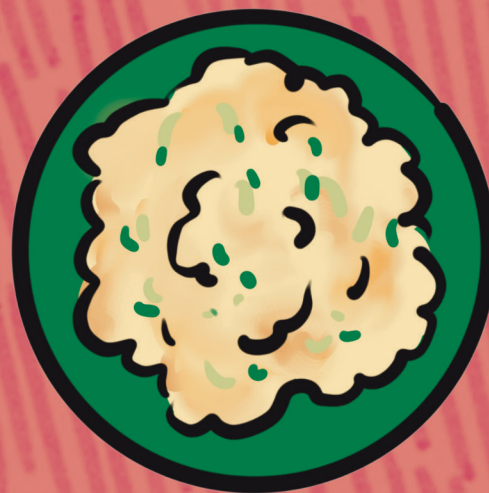
When I get home, Luhambo is excited. He has only had one birthday, on the 28th of April.
